## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to a study by the broadband development office on Internet
- 3 service for multiunit residential properties.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS. In this Act:
- 6 (1) "Broadband service" means Internet service with
- 7 the capability of providing:
- 8 (A) a speed of not less than 100 megabits per
- 9 second for a download;
- 10 (B) a speed of not less than 20 megabits per
- 11 second for an upload; and
- 12 (C) a network round-trip latency of less than or
- 13 equal to 100 milliseconds based on the 95th percentile of speed
- 14 measurements.
- 15 (2) "Multiunit residential property" means improved
- 16 real property with at least 75 dwelling units, including an
- 17 apartment building or condominium. The term does not include a
- 18 hotel, motel, single-family home, or duplex.
- 19 (3) "Office" means the broadband development office.
- 20 SECTION 2. STUDY ON BROADBAND ACCESS FOR MULTIUNIT
- 21 RESIDENTIAL PROPERTIES. (a) The office shall conduct a study on
- 22 the availability of access to Internet service for residents of
- 23 multiunit residential properties in this state.
- 24 (b) The study must:

- 1 (1) identify areas that lack physical infrastructure
- 2 necessary for the provision of broadband service for multiunit
- 3 residential properties;
- 4 (2) compare:
- 5 (A) the number of broadband service providers
- 6 that serve multiunit residential properties in urban areas to the
- 7 number that serve single-family homes in urban areas; and
- 8 (B) average internet speeds available in urban
- 9 areas to multiunit residential properties and to single-family
- 10 homes;
- 11 (3) estimate the average cost of broadband service in
- 12 multiunit residential properties in urban areas;
- 13 (4) determine the percentage of multiunit residential
- 14 properties in urban areas that have access to Internet service
- 15 providers that are capable of providing reliable broadband service;
- 16 (5) assess Internet service downtime and consistency
- 17 of Internet speeds for multiunit residential properties;
- 18 (6) assess the availability and usage of broadband
- 19 affordability programs for multiunit residential properties in
- 20 urban areas;
- 21 (7) assess the effects for tenants of a multiunit
- 22 residential property of the property owner entering into an
- 23 exclusive contract with an Internet service provider for the entire
- 24 property, including effects on service costs;
- 25 (8) assess the effects of municipal regulations and an
- 26 absence of municipal regulations on broadband service
- 27 infrastructure deployment in areas with a high concentration of

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- 1 multiunit residential properties; and
- 2 (9) where possible, include an assessment of whether
- 3 the factors described above differ in low-income areas and
- 4 higher-income areas.
- 5 SECTION 3. REPORT TO THE LEGISLATURE. Not later than
- 6 December 1, 2026, the office shall submit to the governor, the
- 7 lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of representatives,
- 8 and each standing committee of the legislature with jurisdiction
- 9 over broadband service a report that includes the results of the
- 10 study and any recommendations of the office related to the study.
- 11 SECTION 4. EXPIRATION. This Act expires September 1, 2027.
- 12 SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect September
- 13 1, 2025.
