5	SECTION 1. Chapter 24, Property Code, is amended by adding
6	Section 24.012 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 24.012. REMOVAL OF CERTAIN EVICTION CASE INFORMATION
8	FROM CREDIT REPORT. (a) In this section:
9	(1) "Consumer reporting agency" has the meaning
10	assigned by Section 20.01, Business & Commerce Code.
11	(2) "Eviction case" means a lawsuit brought under this
12	chapter to recover possession of leased or rented residential real
13	property from a tenant.
14	(3) "Eviction case information" means all records and
15	files related to a filing of an eviction case, including petitions
16	and dispositions.
17	(b) This section applies only to a residential tenant who:
18	(1) was the defendant in an eviction case in which a
19	judgment was entered for the plaintiff;
20	(2) after entry of the judgment in the eviction case:
21	(A) paid all money owed to the plaintiff; and
22	(B) executed a new lease agreement with the
23	landlord who was the plaintiff in the eviction case; and
24	(3) is not in default under the lease agreement

- 2 (c) A residential tenant may submit to a consumer reporting
- 3 agency a written request to have the eviction case information
- 4 pertaining to an eviction case described by Subsection (b) removed
- 5 from the tenant's credit report.
- 6 (d) Unless required by federal law, a consumer reporting
- 7 agency that receives a written request under Subsection (c):
- 8 <u>(1) may not use the eviction case information that is</u>
- 9 the subject of the written request in a credit report; and
- 10 (2) not later than the 90th day after the date the
- 11 consumer reporting agency receives the request, shall remove the
- 12 eviction case information that is the subject of the request from
- 13 any credit report created or maintained by the consumer reporting
- 14 agency.
- 15 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
