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- 2 relating to compensatory and punitive damage limits in employment
- 3 discrimination claims.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 21.2585, Labor Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsection (d) and adding Subsection (d-1) to read as
- 7 follows:
- 8 (d) <u>Subject to Subsection (d-1), the</u> [The] sum of the amount
- 9 of compensatory damages awarded under this section for future
- 10 pecuniary losses, emotional pain, suffering, inconvenience, mental
- 11 anguish, loss of enjoyment of life, and other nonpecuniary losses
- 12 and the amount of punitive damages awarded under this section may
- 13 not exceed, for each complainant:
- 14 (1) \$50,000 in the case of a respondent that has fewer
- 15 than 101 employees;
- 16 (2) \$100,000 in the case of a respondent that has more
- 17 than 100 and fewer than 201 employees;
- 18 (3) \$200,000 in the case of a respondent that has more
- 19 than 200 and fewer than 501 employees; and
- 20 (4) \$300,000 in the case of a respondent that has more
- 21 than 500 employees.
- 22 (d-1) When the consumer price index increases with respect
- 23 to the amount of that index on September 1, 2025, the limits on
- 24 damages prescribed by Subsection (d) shall be increased by a sum

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- 1 equal to the amount of such limit multiplied by the percentage
- 2 increase in the consumer price index, as published by the Bureau of
- 3 Labor Statistics of the United States Department of Labor, that
- 4 measures the average changes in prices of goods and services
- 5 purchased by urban wage earners and clerical workers' families
- 6 (CPI-W: Seasonally Adjusted U.S. City Average--All Items),
- 7 between September 1, 2025, and the time at which damages subject to
- 8 such limits are awarded by final judgment or settlement.
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 21.2585(d-1), Labor Code, as added by
- 10 this Act, applies only to a complaint in relation to an unlawful
- 11 employment practice that occurs on or after the effective date of
- 12 this Act. A complaint in relation to an unlawful employment
- 13 practice that occurs before the effective date of this Act is
- 14 governed by the law in effect on the date the unlawful employment
- 15 practice occurred, and the former law is continued in effect for
- 16 that purpose.
- 17 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
