A county attorney is not required to obtain the permission of the 17 consumer protection division to prosecute an action under this 18 subchapter for a violation of Section 17.46(b)(27), if the county 19 attorney provides prior written notice to the division as required 20 by Subsection (b). 21
- SECTION 3. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to a cause of action that accrues on or after the effective date of this Act. A cause of action that accrues before the effective date

- 1 of this Act is governed by the law as it existed immediately before
- 2 the effective date of this Act, and that law is continued in effect
- 3 for that purpose.
- 4 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 5 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 6 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 7 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 8 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
