## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2	relating	to	the	collection	of	information	on	available	beds	at

- 3 inpatient mental health facilities providing acute psychiatric
- 4 treatment.

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- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 311.0335(a), Health and Safety Code, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 (a) A hospital that provides mental health or chemical
- 9 dependency services shall submit to the department financial and
- 10 utilization data relating to the mental health and chemical
- 11 dependency services provided by the hospital, including data for
- 12 inpatient and outpatient services relating to:
- 13 (1) patient demographics, including race, ethnicity,
- 14 age, gender, and county of residence;
- 15 (2) admissions;
- 16 (3) discharges, including length of inpatient
- 17 treatment;
- 18 (4) specific diagnoses and procedures according to
- 19 criteria prescribed by the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of
- 20 Mental Disorders, 3rd Edition, Revised, or a later version
- 21 prescribed by department rule;
- 22 (5) total charges and the components of the charges;
- 23 (6) payor sources; [and]
- 24 (7) use of mechanical restraints; and

(8) availability of inpatient psychiatric beds by age. 1 2 SECTION 2. (a) In this section: "Commission" means the Health and Human Services 3 Commission. 4 "Inpatient mental health facility" has the meaning 5 (2) assigned by Section 571.003, Health and Safety Code. 6 7 The commission shall conduct a study regarding the 8 availability of beds at inpatient mental health facilities in this state that provide acute inpatient psychiatric treatment. 9 study must evaluate: 10 (1) the current number of psychiatric beds available 11 at inpatient mental health facilities in this state that provide 12 inpatient psychiatric treatment to individuals experiencing an 13 14 acute mental health crisis, including a breakdown of beds 15 available: 16 (A) at inpatient mental health facilities that 17 are state hospitals operated by the Department of State Health Services; 18 at inpatient mental health facilities other 19 (B) than facilities operated by the Department of State Health 20 Services; and 21 22 (C) for patients: (i) committed to a facility for competency 23 24 restoration services under Chapter 46B, Code of Criminal Procedure;

(ii) civilly committed to a facility under

(iii) committed to a facility after having

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1 been found not guilty by reason of insanity under Chapter 46C, Code
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- 2 of Criminal Procedure;
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  (iv) voluntarily admitted to a facility;
- 4 (v) 18 years of age or older;
- 5 (vi) 12 years of age or older but younger
- 6 than 18 years of age;
- 7 (vii) 11 years of age or younger;
- 8 (viii) receiving long-term mental health
- 9 treatment in a facility; and
- 10 (ix) who have been diagnosed with an
- 11 intellectual or developmental disability;
- 12 (2) the current number of patients admitted to an
- 13 inpatient mental health facility in this state that provides
- 14 inpatient psychiatric treatment to individuals experiencing an
- 15 acute mental health crisis, including a breakdown of:
- 16 (A) the number of patients committed to a
- 17 facility for competency restoration services under Chapter 46B,
- 18 Code of Criminal Procedure, including the number of individuals
- 19 committed under an initial order of commitment or an order
- 20 extending the initial restoration period;
- 21 (B) the number of patients civilly committed to a
- 22 facility under Chapter 841, Health and Safety Code;
- (C) the number of patients committed to a
- 24 facility after having been found not guilty by reason of insanity
- 25 under Chapter 46C, Code of Criminal Procedure;
- 26 (D) the number of patients voluntarily admitted
- 27 to a facility;

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- 1 (E) the number of patients 18 years of age or
- 2 older;
- 3 (F) the number of patients 12 years of age or
- 4 older but younger than 18 years of age;
- 5 (G) the number of patients 11 years of age or
- 6 younger;
- 7 (H) the percentage of patients in this state who
- 8 will likely require long-term mental health treatment in a
- 9 facility;
- 10 (I) the number of patients who have been
- 11 diagnosed with an intellectual or developmental disability; and
- 12 (J) the number of patients receiving services
- 13 from a jail diversion program;
- 14 (3) the projected need over the next several years for
- 15 additional psychiatric beds at inpatient mental health facilities
- 16 that provide inpatient psychiatric treatment to individuals
- 17 experiencing an acute mental health crisis, including the projected
- 18 percentage of incoming patients who will likely require long-term
- 19 mental health treatment in a facility; and
- 20 (4) current and anticipated resources, including
- 21 workforce needs, necessary to meet the demands described by
- 22 Subdivisions (1), (2), and (3) of this subsection.
- (c) In designing and conducting the study, the commission:
- 24 (1) may collaborate with institutions of higher
- 25 education, as defined by Section 61.003, Education Code, in this
- 26 state that award medical degrees; and
- 27 (2) shall collect the information required under

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- 1 Subsection (b) of this section at least twice.
- 2 (d) Not later than September 1, 2026, the commission shall
- 3 prepare and submit to the legislature a written report containing
- 4 the results of the study and any recommendations for legislative or
- 5 other action.
- 6 (e) This section expires September 1, 2027.
- 7 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
