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## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the confidentiality of information used to prevent, detect, respond to, or investigate a hostile act of a foreign 3 adversary of the United States. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. Section 418.176(a), Government Code, is amended to read as follows: 7 (a) Information is confidential if the information 8 is 9 collected, assembled, or maintained by or for a governmental entity 10 for the purpose of preventing, detecting, responding to, or investigating an act of terrorism or related criminal activity or a 11 12 hostile act by a foreign adversary of the United States and: 13 (1) relates to the staffing requirements of an 14 emergency response provider, including a law enforcement agency, a 15 fire-fighting agency, or an emergency services agency; 16 (2) relates to a tactical plan of the provider; or 17 (3) consists of a list or compilation of pager or telephone numbers, including mobile and cellular telephone 18 numbers, of the provider. 19 20 SECTION 2. Section 418.177, Government Code, is amended to 21 read as follows: 22 Sec. 418.177. CONFIDENTIALITY OF CERTAIN INFORMATION 23 RELATING TO RISK OR VULNERABILITY ASSESSMENT. Information is confidential if the information: 24

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(1) is collected, assembled, or maintained by or for a
 governmental entity for the purpose of preventing, detecting, or
 investigating an act of terrorism or related criminal activity <u>or a</u>
 <u>hostile act by a foreign adversary of the United States</u>; and

5 (2) relates to an assessment by or for a governmental 6 entity, or an assessment that is maintained by a governmental 7 entity, of the risk or vulnerability of persons or property, 8 including critical infrastructure, to an act of terrorism or 9 related criminal activity.

SECTION 3. Section 418.179(a), Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

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(a) Information is confidential if the information:

(1) is collected, assembled, or maintained by or for a
governmental entity for the purpose of preventing, detecting, or
investigating an act of terrorism or related criminal activity <u>or a</u>
<u>hostile act by a foreign adversary of the United States</u>; and

17 (2) relates to the details of the encryption codes or18 security keys for a public communications system.

SECTION 4. Section 418.180, Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

21 Sec. 418.180. CONFIDENTIALITY OF CERTAIN INFORMATION 22 PREPARED FOR UNITED STATES. Information, other than financial 23 information, in the possession of a governmental entity is 24 confidential if the information:

(1) is part of a report to an agency of the UnitedStates;

(2) relates to an act of terrorism or related criminal

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activity <u>or a hostile act by a foreign adversary of the United</u>
 <u>States</u>; and

3 (3) is specifically required to be kept confidential:
4 (A) under Section 552.101 because of a federal
5 statute or regulation;

6 (B) to participate in a state-federal 7 information sharing agreement; or

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(C) to obtain federal funding.

9 SECTION 5. Section 418.181, Government Code, is amended to 10 read as follows:

11 Sec. 418.181. CONFIDENTIALITY OF CERTAIN INFORMATION 12 RELATING TO CRITICAL INFRASTRUCTURE. Those documents or portions 13 of documents in the possession of a governmental entity are 14 confidential if they identify the technical details of particular 15 vulnerabilities of critical infrastructure to an act of terrorism 16 <u>or a hostile act by a foreign adversary of the United States</u>.

SECTION 6. Section 418.182(a), Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

19 (a) Except as provided by Subsections (b) and (c), 20 information, including access codes and passwords, in the possession of a governmental entity is confidential if the 21 information [that] relates to the specifications, operating 22 procedures, or location of a security system used to protect public 23 or private property from an act of terrorism or related criminal 24 activity or a hostile act by a foreign adversary of the United 25 26 States [is confidential].

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SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

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a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
