4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 461A, Health and Safety
6	Code, is amended by adding Section 461A.060 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 461A.060. BIENNIAL REPORT ON OPIOID ANTAGONIST
8	PROGRAMS FOR OPIOID OVERDOSE REVERSAL AND PREVENTION. (a) In this
9	section, "opioid antagonist" has the meaning assigned by Section
10	483.101.
11	(b) Not later than October 1 of each even-numbered year, the
12	commission shall:
13	(1) prepare a report evaluating the distribution of
14	opioid antagonists in this state to reverse and prevent opioio
15	overdoses; and
16	(2) submit the report to the governor, the lieutenant
17	governor, and the speaker of the house of representatives.
18	(c) The report described by Subsection (b) must:
19	(1) include a needs assessment for the opioid
20	antagonist program established under Section 461A.059;
21	(2) establish a statewide saturation goal for opioid
22	antagonists and include:

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methodology used to estimate insufficiencies in the current supply

(A) a description of the data sources and

- 1 of opioid antagonists; and
- 2 (B) a communications plan to address opioid
- 3 overdoses in areas of this state at higher risk for increased
- 4 numbers of overdoses;
- 5 (3) include a description of all state and federal
- 6 money appropriated to the opioid antagonist program established
- 7 under Section 461A.059;
- 8 (4) establish opioid antagonist distribution
- 9 strategies for this state;
- 10 (5) list and describe all available state and
- 11 federally funded purchase and distribution programs for opioid
- 12 antagonists; and
- 13 (6) recommend improvements for addressing opioid
- 14 overdoses among high-risk populations, including school-aged
- 15 children, pregnant and postpartum women, and individuals residing
- 16 <u>in rural areas of this state.</u>
- 17 (d) In preparing the report under this section, the
- 18 commission shall coordinate and consult with each state agency,
- 19 institution of higher education, and political subdivision of this
- 20 state that receives funding or other resources under Section
- 21 461A.059 for the distribution of opioid antagonists.
- 22 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
