- 7 amended by adding Section 39.1517 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 39.1517. DISCLOSURE OF PUBLIC INFORMATION BY GOVERNING
- 9 BODY OF INDEPENDENT ORGANIZATION. A provision of law that makes
- 10 information confidential or not subject to disclosure under Chapter
- 11 552, Government Code, or another provision of law, that applies to
- 12 the commission applies in the same manner to an independent
- 13 organization certified under Section 39.151.
- 14 SECTION 3. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 15 a request for public information received on or after the effective
- 16 date of this Act. A request for public information received before
- 17 the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect when
- 18 the request was received, and the former law is continued in effect
- 19 for that purpose.
- 20 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
