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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 1 AN ACT
- 2 relating to the use of the skills development fund by certain
- 3 entities.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 303.001(a), Labor Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 (a) The purpose of this chapter is to remove administrative
- 8 barriers that impede the response of public community and technical
- 9 colleges, community-based organizations, local workforce
- 10 development boards, the Texas A&M Engineering Experiment Station,
- 11 and the Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service to industry and
- 12 workforce training needs and to develop incentives for public
- 13 community and technical colleges, community-based organizations,
- 14 local workforce development boards, the Texas A&M Engineering
- 15 Experiment Station, and the Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service
- 16 to provide customized assessment and training in a timely and
- 17 efficient manner.
- SECTION 2. Section 303.002(b), Labor Code, is amended to
- 19 read as follows:
- 20 (b) A public community or technical college, the Texas A&M
- 21 Engineering Experiment Station, or the Texas A&M Engineering
- 22 Extension Service may recover customized assessment and training
- 23 costs incurred by the college, station, or service [institution]
- 24 if:

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- 1 (1) there is an actual or projected labor shortage in
- 2 the occupation in which training is provided that is not being met
- 3 by an existing institution or program in the area; and
- 4 (2) the wages at the time of job placement for
- 5 individuals who successfully complete customized training at the
- 6 public community or technical college, the Texas A&M Engineering
- 7 Experiment Station, or the Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service
- 8 are equal to the prevailing wage for that occupation in the local
- 9 labor market area.
- 10 SECTION 3. Sections 303.003(b), (f), (g), and (h), Labor
- 11 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 12 (b) The skills development fund may be used by public
- 13 community and technical colleges, community-based organizations,
- 14 local workforce development boards, the Texas A&M Engineering
- 15 Experiment Station, and the Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service
- 16 as start-up or emergency funds for the following job-training
- 17 purposes:
- 18 (1) developing customized training programs for
- 19 businesses and trade unions; and
- 20 (2) sponsoring small and medium-sized business
- 21 networks and consortiums.
- 22 (f) The <u>Texas A&M Engineering Experiment Station and the</u>
- 23 Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service shall focus the station's
- 24 or service's training activities under this chapter on programs
- 25 that:
- 26 (1) are statewide in nature; or
- 27 (2) are not available from a local junior college

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- 1 district, a local technical college, or a consortium of junior
- 2 college districts.
- 3 (g) This section does not prohibit the Texas A&M Engineering
- 4 Experiment Station or the Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service
- 5 from participating in a consortium of junior college districts or
- 6 with a technical college that provides training under this chapter.
- 7 (h) A community-based organization may apply for money to
- 8 participate in a training program only in partnership with a
- 9 community and technical college, the Texas A&M Engineering
- 10 Experiment Station, or the Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service.
- 11 A community-based organization providing services regulated by the
- 12 state shall provide evidence of any certification, license, or
- 13 registration required by law.
- SECTION 4. Section 303.004, Labor Code, is amended to read
- 15 as follows:
- 16 Sec. 303.004. FUND REVIEW; REPORT BY CERTAIN WORKFORCE
- 17 TRAINING PROVIDERS REQUIRED. (a) The Texas Higher Education
- 18 Coordinating Board shall review all customized training programs
- 19 biennially to verify that state funds are being used appropriately
- 20 by public community and technical colleges, the Texas A&M
- 21 Engineering Experiment Station, and the Texas A&M Engineering
- 22 Extension Service under this chapter.
- 23 (b) Not later than October 1 of each even-numbered year, the
- 24 Texas A&M Engineering Experiment Station, the Texas A&M Engineering
- 25 Extension Service, and each public community or technical college
- 26 that provides workforce training under this chapter shall:
- 27 (1) conduct a review of the station's, service's, or

- 1 college's training programs to:
- 2 (A) determine the effectiveness of the programs
- 3 in improving the wages of participants who complete the programs;
- 4 and
- 5 (B) identify strategies for improving the
- 6 delivery of workforce training in order to more effectively impact
- 7 economic development in this state; and
- 8 (2) submit to the commission a detailed written report
- 9 summarizing the results of the review for inclusion by the
- 10 executive director in the report to the governor and the
- 11 legislature required by Section 303.006(c).
- 12 (c) If the Texas A&M Engineering Experiment Station, the
- 13 Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service $\underline{\,\prime\,}$ or a public community or
- 14 technical college fails to submit a report required by Subsection
- 15 (b)(2):
- 16 (1) the <u>station</u>, service, or college must refund to
- 17 the comptroller any unexpended state funds received by the station,
- 18 service, or college under this chapter for the state fiscal
- 19 biennium in which the report was due; and
- 20 (2) the commission may not award any additional grant
- 21 to the $\underline{\text{station}}$, $\underline{\text{service}}$, or college under this chapter until the
- 22 station, service, or college has complied with that reporting
- 23 requirement.
- SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
