A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 2 relating to voter registration.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 12, Election Code, is
- 5 amended by adding Section 12.007 to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 12.007. CERTAIN ELECTION OFFICERS ARE VOTER
- 7 REGISTRARS. An election officer serving a polling place for early
- 8 voting by personal appearance is a deputy voter registrar and has
- 9 the same authority as a regular deputy registrar.
- SECTION 2. Section 13.001(b), Election Code, is amended to
- 11 read as follows:
- 12 (b) To be eligible to apply for registration, a person must,
- 13 on the date the registration application is submitted to the
- 14 registrar, be at least 17 years [and 10 months] of age and satisfy
- 15 the requirements of Subsection (a) except for age.
- 16 SECTION 3. Subchapter A, Chapter 13, Election Code, is
- 17 amended by adding Section 13.009 to read as follows:
- 18 Sec. 13.009. ELECTRONIC VOTER REGISTRATION. (a) The
- 19 secretary of state shall, in coordination with the Department of
- 20 Public Safety, implement a program to allow a person with an
- 21 unexpired driver's license or personal identification card issued
- 22 in this state to complete a voter registration application over the
- 23 Internet from a secure Internet website.
- 24 (b) The Internet website established under this section

- 1 must allow a person to submit:
- 2 (1) an initial application for registration; and
- 3 (2) an application to update a voter registration
- 4 record.
- 5 (c) When a person submits an application under this section,
- 6 the secretary of state shall compare the information provided by
- 7 the applicant against Department of Public Safety records.
- 8 (d) The completed online application and information from
- 9 the Department of Public Safety, including the applicant's digital
- 10 signature, shall be provided to:
- 11 (1) the county voter registration office for the
- 12 county where the applicant currently resides; and
- 13 (2) the secretary of state for the statewide
- 14 computerized voter registration list under Section 18.061.
- (e) An application electronically submitted under this
- 16 <u>section is considered for all purposes as an application submitted</u>
- 17 by mail under this title. A digital signature given as provided by
- 18 secretary of state rule meets the signature requirement under
- 19 Section 13.002(b).
- 20 (f) The secretary of state shall adopt rules as necessary to
- 21 <u>implement this section</u>.
- 22 SECTION 4. Section 13.046, Election Code, is amended by
- 23 amending Subsection (d) and adding Subsection (d-1) to read as
- 24 follows:
- 25 (d) At least twice each school year, a high school deputy
- 26 registrar shall distribute an officially prescribed registration
- 27 application form to each student who is or will be 18 years of age or

- 1 older during that year, subject to rules prescribed by the
- 2 secretary of state. A high school deputy registrar shall annually
- 3 submit the number of registration application forms distributed
- 4 under this section and the number of students whose year of birth
- 5 was at least 18 years ago to the secretary of state.
- 6 (d-1) The secretary of state shall publish and maintain on
- 7 the agency's Internet website a list of high schools to which
- 8 Subsection (d) applies and indicate whether the school is in
- 9 compliance with that subsection.
- 10 SECTION 5. Chapter 62, Election Code, is amended by adding
- 11 Section 62.0015 to read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 62.0015. VOTER REGISTRARS MUST BE PRESENT. Two voter
- 13 registrars must be present at each polling place while the polls are
- 14 open.
- SECTION 6. Chapter 63, Election Code, is amended by adding
- 16 Section 63.010 to read as follows:
- Sec. 63.010. REGISTRATION AT POLLING PLACE. (a) A person
- 18 who would be eligible to vote in an election under Section 11.001,
- 19 but for the requirement to be a registered voter, shall be accepted
- 20 <u>during voting by personal appearance for voting the ballot</u> for the
- 21 precinct of the person's residence as shown by the identification
- 22 presented if, on the day the person offers to vote, the person:
- 23 (1) submits a voter registration application that
- 24 complies with Section 13.002 to an election officer at the polling
- 25 place; and
- 26 (2) presents as proof of residence a form of photo
- 27 identification described by Section 63.0101(a) that states the

- 1 person's current address.
- 2 (b) The election officer shall return the original proof of
- 3 residence to the voter.
- 4 (c) A person voting under this section shall vote a
- 5 provisional ballot in the manner provided by Section 63.011 except
- 6 that the person is not required to submit the affidavit under
- 7 <u>Section 63.011(a).</u>
- 8 (d) For each registration corresponding to a ballot cast
- 9 <u>under this section, the voter regi</u>strar shall review the
- 10 application and determine whether the applicant is eligible for
- 11 registration as provided by Subchapter C, Chapter 13. A
- 12 registration approved under this subsection takes effect on the
- 13 date the vote was cast.
- 14 (e) The secretary of state may by rule:
- 15 (1) designate additional documents that a person may
- 16 offer to prove the person's residence to register and vote under
- 17 this section; and
- 18 (2) prescribe procedures to implement this section.
- 19 SECTION 7. Section 65.051(a), Election Code, is amended to
- 20 read as follows:
- 21 (a) The early voting ballot board shall verify and count
- 22 provisional ballots as provided by this subchapter not later than
- 23 the 10th [ninth] day after the date of an election.
- SECTION 8. Section 67.003(b), Election Code, is amended to
- 25 read as follows:
- 26 (b) Each [Except as provided by Subsection (c), each] local
- 27 canvassing authority shall convene to conduct the local canvass at

- 1 the time set by the canvassing authority's presiding officer not
- 2 later than the 14th [11th] day after election day and not earlier
- 3 than the later of:
- 4 (1) the third day after election day;
- 5 (2) the date on which the early voting ballot board has
- 6 verified and counted all provisional ballots, if a provisional
- 7 ballot has been cast in the election; or
- 8 (3) the date on which all timely received ballots cast
- 9 from addresses outside of the United States are counted, if a ballot
- 10 to be voted by mail in the election was provided to a person outside
- 11 of the United States.
- 12 SECTION 9. Section 85.031(a), Election Code, is amended to
- 13 read as follows:
- 14 (a) For each person entitled to vote an early voting ballot
- 15 by personal appearance or entitled to register at a polling place,
- 16 the early voting clerk shall follow the procedure for accepting or
- 17 registering a regular voter on election day, with the modifications
- 18 necessary for the conduct of early voting.
- 19 SECTION 10. Section 67.003(c), Election Code, is repealed.
- 20 SECTION 11. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
