| 6 | SECTION 1. Chapter 547, Government Code, as effective April |
| 7 | 1, 2025, is amended by adding Subchapter K to read as follows: |
| 8 | SUBCHAPTER K. BEHAVIORAL HEALTH CRISIS SERVICES |
| 9 | Sec. 547.0501. 988 SUICIDE AND CRISIS LIFELINE TRUST FUND. |
| 10 | (a) The 988 suicide and crisis lifeline trust fund is established |
| 11 | as a trust fund to be held by the comptroller outside the state |
| 12 | treasury and administered by the commission. |
| 13 | (b) The trust fund consists of: |
| 14 | (1) revenue derived from the fee described by Section |
| 15 | <u>547.0505;</u> |
| 16 | (2) legislative appropriations of money for the |
| 17 | <pre>purposes of this subchapter;</pre> |
| 18 | (3) available federal funding this state allocates for |
| 19 | the purposes of the 988 Suicide & Crisis Lifeline; |
| 20 | (4) gifts, grants, and donations received by this |
| 21 | state for the purposes of the trust fund; |
| 22 | (5) interest, dividends, and other income of the trust |
| 23 | fund; and |
| 24 | (6) money from any other source that is deposited in or |

- 2 (c) Money deposited in the trust fund may only be used to:
- 3 (1) implement, maintain, or improve the 988 Suicide &
- 4 Crisis Lifeline, including personnel and technological
- 5 infrastructure improvements necessary to achieve operational and
- 6 clinical standards and best practices as provided by the National
- 7 Suicide Prevention Lifeline;
- 8 (2) provide funding for crisis outreach and other
- 9 services a community mental health center provides in response to
- 10 the 988 Suicide & Crisis Lifeline;
- 11 (3) provide funding for uninsured individuals
- 12 receiving crisis and stabilization services;
- 13 (4) provide personnel for crisis centers, mobile
- 14 crisis outreach teams, and youth crisis outreach teams;
- 15 (5) fund data provision, reporting, participation in
- 16 evaluations, and other related quality improvement activities; and
- 17 (6) administer, oversee, and evaluate the trust fund.
- 18 (d) The state may not transfer or use trust fund assets for
- 19 any purpose other than the uses provided in this section.
- 20 (e) The executive commissioner shall submit an annual
- 21 report to the legislature and the Federal Communications Commission
- 22 <u>detailing the trust fund deposits and expenditures in the preceding</u>
- 23 <u>year.</u>
- Sec. 547.0502. 988 SUICIDE AND CRISIS LIFELINE FEE. (a)
- 25 The commission, in collaboration with the Commission on State
- 26 Emergency Communications, may impose a 988 suicide and crisis
- 27 lifeline service fee to supplement any federal, state, or local

- 1 funding for suicide prevention or behavioral health crisis services
- 2 on each:
- 3 (1) local exchange access line or equivalent local
- 4 exchange access line, not including public telephone equipment
- 5 operated by coin or by card reader;
- 6 (2) wireless telecommunications connection;
- 7 (3) Voice over Internet Protocol service connection;
- 8 and
- 9 (4) purchase of a prepaid wireless telecommunications
- 10 service by any method.
- 11 (b) The executive commissioner by rule shall set the fee in
- 12 an amount sufficient to cover the costs of creating, operating, and
- 13 maintaining the suicide prevention services provided under this
- 14 subchapter, according to the national guidelines for crisis
- 15 services. The commission shall periodically adjust the fee amount
- 16 as necessary to provide for continuous operation, volume increases,
- 17 and maintenance.
- 18 (c) Revenue from the fee shall be deposited in the 988
- 19 suicide and crisis lifeline trust fund established under Section
- 20 547.0504.
- 21 (d) A fee collected under this section may only be used to
- 22 offset costs as provided by 47 U.S.C. Section 251a.
- (e) Revenue from the fee may not be used for expenses that
- 24 are:
- 25 (1) reimbursable through Medicaid, Medicare, or
- 26 another insurer or governmental program; or
- 27 (2) covered because the service recipient's name and

- 1 health coverage information cannot be obtained or billed.
- 2 (f) The executive commissioner shall submit an annual
- 3 report to the legislature and the Federal Communications Commission
- 4 detailing the revenue generated by the fee in the preceding year.
- 5 Sec. 547.0503. ANNUAL REPORT. (a) The commission shall
- 6 prepare an annual report of the usage of crisis centers and the
- 7 services provided by the centers.
- 8 (b) The commission shall present the annual report to the
- 9 legislature and the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services
- 10 Administration.
- 11 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
