- 2 relating to certain interests of the Health and Human Services

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS. (a) In this Act:
- 6 (1) "Center" means the Bexar County Board of Trustees
- 7 for Mental Health Mental Retardation Services d/b/a The Center for
- 8 Health Care Services.
- 9 (2) "Commission" means the Health and Human Services
- 10 Commission.
- 11 SECTION 2. EXTENSION OF REVERSION PERIOD. (a) The
- 12 commission may by appropriate instrument extend to one year the
- 13 period during which the center may fail to use the property
- 14 described by Section 3 of this Act in the manner described by
- 15 Chapter 423 (H.B. 2039), Acts of the 81st Legislature, Regular
- 16 Session, 2009, before the ownership of the property automatically
- 17 reverts to the commission.
- 18 (b) Consideration for the extension authorized by
- 19 Subsection (a) of this section shall be in the form of an agreement
- 20 between the commission and the center that requires the center to
- 21 report to the commission not less than once every three months
- 22 regarding the center's use of the property.
- 23 (c) The construction, renovation, repair, or other
- 24 maintenance of property described by Section 3 of this Act

- 6 SECTION 3. PROPERTY SUBJECT TO REVERSIONARY INTEREST. The
- 7 real property to which Section 2 of this Act applies is situated in
- 8 Bexar County, Texas, and is described more particularly as follows:
- 9 A 1.277 acre tract of land, more or less, out of the Richard
- 10 Buschel Survey No. 325, County Block 5053, Bexar County, Texas and
- 11 more commonly known as 8155 and 8165 Lone Shadow Trail, Converse,
- 12 Texas 78109.
- Lots 7 And 8, Block J, LINKWOOD ADDITION, in the City Of Leon
- 14 Valley, Bexar County, Texas, according to plat thereof, recorded In
- 15 Volume 5580, Page 114, Deed And Plat Records Of Bexar County, Texas
- 16 and more commonly known as 7622 Linkside Drive, Leon Valley, Texas
- 17 78240.
- 18 Lot 16, Block 2, New City Block 13819, TERRACE NORTH
- 19 SUBDIVISION, in the City of San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas,
- 20 according to plat thereof recorded in Volume 5580, Page 260, Deed
- 21 And Plat Records Of Bexar County, Texas and more commonly known as
- 22 2927 Eisenhauer Road, San Antonio, Texas 78209.
- 23 SECTION 4. TRANSFER OF PROPERTY. (a) The commission may
- 24 transfer to the center the real property described by Section 5 of
- 25 this Act:
- 26 (1) including improvements to the property; and
- 27 (2) excluding the mineral interests in and under the

- 1 property.
- 2 (b) Consideration for the transfer authorized by Subsection 3 (a) of this section shall be in the form of an agreement between the
- 4 commission and the center that requires the center to use the
- 5 property in a manner that primarily promotes a public purpose of the
- 6 state by using the property to provide community-based mental
- 7 health or mental retardation services and to report to the
- 8 commission not less than once every three months regarding the
- 9 center's use of the property. The construction, renovation,
- 10 repair, or other maintenance of property described by Section 5 of
- 11 this Act undertaken to facilitate the property's use to provide
- 12 community-based mental health or mental retardation services is
- 13 considered use of the property in the manner described by this
- 14 subsection.
- 15 (c) If the center fails to use the property in the manner
- 16 described by an agreement under Subsection (b) of this section for
- 17 more than 365 continuous days, ownership of the property
- 18 automatically reverts to the commission.
- 19 (d) The commission shall transfer the property by a deed
- 20 that:
- 21 (1) is without warranties regarding covenants of
- 22 title; and
- 23 (2) includes a provision that:
- 24 (A) requires the center to:
- (i) use the property in a manner that
- 26 primarily promotes a public purpose of the state by using the
- 27 property to provide community-based mental health and mental

- 1 retardation services; and
- 2 (ii) report to the commission not less than
- 3 once every three months regarding the center's use of the property;
- 4 and
- 5 (B) indicates that ownership of the property
- 6 automatically reverts to the commission if the center fails to use
- 7 the property in the manner described by Paragraph (A) of this
- 8 subdivision for more than 365 continuous days.
- 9 (e) The state reserves:
- 10 (1) the state's interest in all oil, gas, and other
- 11 minerals in and under the real property described by Section 5 of
- 12 this Act;
- 13 (2) the state's right to remove from the real property
- 14 described by Section 5 of this Act any oil, gas, and other minerals
- 15 in and under the real property; and
- 16 (3) the state's right to grant a lease held by the
- 17 state before a conveyance of real property described by Section 5 of
- 18 this Act relating to the removal of oil, gas, and other minerals in
- 19 and under the real property.
- 20 (f) Sections 533.084 and 533.087, Health and Safety Code,
- 21 and Sections 31.1571 and 31.158, Natural Resources Code, do not
- 22 apply to a transfer of real property authorized by this Act.
- 23 SECTION 5. PROPERTY SUBJECT TO TRANSFER. The real property
- 24 to which Section 4 of this Act applies is situated in Bexar County,
- 25 Texas, and is described more particularly as follows:
- Lots 34, and 35, Block 1, WOODLAKE, UNIT 7E, Bexar County,
- 27 Texas, according to plat thereof recorded in Volume 9503, pages

- 1 151-152, Deed and Plat Records of Bexar County, Texas and more
- 2 commonly known as 6718 Calm Lake Road, San Antonio, Texas 78244.
- 3 SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
- 4 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members
- 5 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas
- 6 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for
- 7 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
