CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Autry Carl Stephens, a giant of the Permian Basin's 2 oil and gas industry, passed away on August 16, 2024, at the age of 3 86, bringing a great loss to his family and many friends; and

WHEREAS, The son of Martin Elmore Stephens and Lila "Hazel" 4 5 Stephens, Autry Stephens was born in De Leon on March 8, 1938; he grew up on the family farm and earned both his bachelor's and 6 7 master's degrees in petroleum engineering from The University of Texas at Austin; during his early years with Humble Oil, he was 8 granted a leave of absence to serve in the U.S. Army Corps of 9 Engineers and rose to the rank of first lieutenant; he went on to 10 join First National Bank of Midland as a petroleum engineer and loan 11 12 officer before becoming a consultant and then an independent oil 13 producer; and

14 WHEREAS, Mr. Stephens established Endeavor Energy Resources in 2000, and his diligence, determination, and willingness to take 15 16 bold risks built the company into a multibillion dollar enterprise ranked among the nation's largest private oil producers; dedicated 17 to his employees, he was a caring, generous mentor and celebrated 18 all their achievements; he believed in handshake deals and enjoyed 19 the camaraderie of his profession, especially over a cup of coffee 20 21 at the Petroleum Club of Midland; under his leadership, Endeavor engaged in extensive philanthropy, helping fund a new volunteer 22 23 fire station in eastern Midland County and supporting such organizations as Habitat for Humanity and the Museum of the 24

1 Southwest; moreover, the firm became a founding member of the Permian Strategic Partnership, a group of energy companies united 2 3 in the goal of improving education, health care, housing, infrastructure, and workforce development; his myriad accolades 4 5 included a Distinguished Alumnus Award from the Texas Exes and the prestigious Top Hand Award from the Permian Basin Petroleum 6 Association; and 7

8 WHEREAS, Above all, Mr. Stephens was devoted to his wife, 9 Linda, and their children, Joe and Lyndal; he eventually knew the 10 joy of welcoming two grandchildren into his treasured family, and 11 he delighted in hearing and sharing stories about all their antics 12 and accomplishments; and

13 WHEREAS, Autry Stephens created a legacy that will resonate 14 in the Permian Basin for years to come, and those he left behind 15 will cherish their memories of his warmth, kindness, courage, and 16 wonderfully dry sense of humor; now, therefore, be it

17 RESOLVED, That the 89th Legislature of the State of Texas 18 hereby pay tribute to the life of Autry Carl Stephens and extend 19 sincere condolences to the members of his family: to his wife, Linda 20 Nagy Stephens; to his children, Joseph Stephens and his wife, 21 Deanna, and Lyndal Stephens Greth and her husband, Richard; to his 22 grandchildren; to his sister, Debra, and her husband, Jack; and to 23 his many other relatives and friends; and, be it further
