WHEREAS, The son of Dr. Dewitt H. Hotchkiss and Esther

14 WHEREAS, Mr. Hotchkiss worked in sales in Houston and Lubbock

15 following his graduation from college, and in 1971, he and his

16 family moved to Midland; in the ensuing years, he sold computers and

17 ran a garage door company; he also earned his real estate license

18 and began buying and selling properties, managing rentals, and

19 flipping houses alongside his wife; in 1983, he opened Murray's

20 Deli in downtown Midland, followed by several other locations and a

21 bakery, and he went on to establish a retail business called The

22 Fire Place before retiring; and

WHEREAS, Engaged in his community, Mr. Hotchkiss gave

24 generously of his time by volunteering with his church, local

- 1 schools and PTAs, and a number of other organizations, including
- 2 Hospice of Midland, Keep Midland Beautiful, Master Gardeners, the
- 3 Museum of the Southwest, and United Way; in addition, he served on
- 4 the Midland City Council and as mayor pro tempore, and he further
- 5 distinguished himself as chair of the Midland Planning and Zoning
- 6 Commission, chair of the Parks and Recreation Commission, and a
- 7 member of the Oil and Gas Advisory Committee; in his leisure hours,
- 8 he enjoyed traveling and spending time with his loved ones, and he
- 9 was known for his exceptional cooking skills; and

- 11 generosity of spirit, and his joyous zest for life, Bart Hotchkiss
- 12 enriched the lives of all who knew him, and they will forever hold
