## A JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 proposing a constitutional amendment changing the vote requirement
- 2 in the legislature to approve a proposed constitutional amendment
- 3 for submission to the voters of this state to two-thirds of the
- 4 members present in each chamber of the legislature.
- 5 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 1(a), Article XVII, Texas Constitution,
- 7 is amended to read as follows:
- 8 (a) The <u>legislature</u> [<u>Legislature</u>], at any regular session,
- 9 or at any special session when the matter is included within the
- 10 purposes for which the session is convened, may propose amendments
- 11 revising the <u>constitution</u> [Constitution], to be voted upon by the
- 12 qualified voters for statewide offices and propositions, as defined
- 13 in the <u>constitution</u> [<del>Constitution</del>] and statutes of this <u>state</u>
- 14 [State]. The date of the elections shall be specified by the
- 15 <u>legislature</u> [<u>Legislature</u>]. The proposal for submission must be
- 16 approved by an affirmative [a] vote in each house of two-thirds of
- 17 [all] the members <u>present</u> [elected to each House], entered by yeas
- 18 and nays on the journals.
- 19 SECTION 2. This proposed constitutional amendment shall be
- 20 submitted to the voters at an election to be held November 4, 2025.
- 21 The ballot shall be printed to permit voting for or against the
- 22 proposition: "The constitutional amendment changing the vote
- 23 requirement in the legislature to approve a proposed constitutional
- 24 amendment for submission to the voters of this state to two-thirds
