RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Residents of Austin lost a visionary civic leader 2 with the passing of former city council member Chris Riley on July 28, 2024, at the age of 60; and 3 WHEREAS, The son of Eva and Peter Riley, Chris Riley was born 4 5 in Austin in 1964; he worked as a congressional page in Washington, D.C., as an Austin High School student; after receiving a 6 7 bachelor's degree in economics from Harvard University, he completed his law degree at The University of Texas at Austin; he 8 9 was employed by the Texas Supreme Court before entering private practice; a dedicated urbanist, he made his home in downtown Austin 10 11 when the residential population was in decline, and in 1997 he 12 cofounded the Downtown Austin Neighborhood Association, which he later served as president; preferring to commute by bike, he got rid 13 of his car, and he encouraged greater use of Wooldridge Square Park 14 by picking up trash and bringing a giant chess set to the park for 15 16 weekly games; he also led Bike Austin before facilitating its merger with other groups to form Safe Streets Austin; and 17 18 WHEREAS, Mr. Riley served for seven years on the Planning Commission and won election to the city council in 2009; during two 19 terms in office, he championed greater density to provide more 20 21 housing; he was instrumental in the city's adoption of its Bicycle Master Plan and the National Association of City Transportation 22 23 Officials' street design standards, recognizing the need for better

infrastructure for pedestrians and cyclists; moreover,

- 1 passionate advocacy eventually led the city to embrace such
- 2 concepts as parking reform, accessory dwelling units, and mass
- 3 transit-adjacent density; continuing his mission in private life,
- 4 he earned a master's degree in urban placemaking and management
- 5 from the Pratt Institute in New York; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Chris Riley helped guide Austin's progress as a
- 7 vibrant, well-connected city, and his kindness, integrity, and
- 8 devotion to his community will remain a source of inspiration to all
- 9 who were privileged to know him; now, therefore, be it

- 11 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the life of Chris Riley and extend
- 12 sincere sympathy to the members of his family: to his wife, Denise

- 14 Laves Reitblatt and her husband, David, Ken Riley, and Michael
- 15 Riley and his wife, Virginia; and to his many other relatives and
