RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Many notable citizens of Lubbock are visiting the 2 Texas Capitol on February 19, 2025, to pay tribute to their city's 3 rich heritage and to celebrate Lubbock Day; and

WHEREAS, Located within the Llano Estacado, Lubbock was established in an area that was known for its tough conditions; as a result, it was settled long after many other parts of the North American continent, and the citizens who reside there today reflect the same welcoming and resilient pioneer spirit as the early founders; and

10 WHEREAS, The City of Lubbock was incorporated on March 16, 11 1909; railroads, farming, and ranching stimulated the city's growth 12 as a trade center, and when legislation creating Texas 13 Technological College was passed in 1923, the site selection 14 committee, impressed by the enthusiasm and hospitality of its 15 citizens, chose Lubbock for its location; and

16 WHEREAS, Today, with a metropolitan area of more than 400,000 17 people, Lubbock is home to the Texas Tech University System and its 18 flagship institutions, Texas Tech University and the Texas Tech 19 Health Sciences Center, both world-renowned organizations; and

20 WHEREAS, The Texas Tech Health Sciences Center attracts 21 nearly 5,500 students from around the world and is currently ranked 22 as the number one health university in the nation by the 23 SR Education Group, ranking higher than programs at rival Ivy 24 League colleges; and

1 WHEREAS, Lubbock is consistently recognized by national 2 organizations for its business-friendly atmosphere, including 3 being named the number one city for women professionals; it is 4 ranked in the top 20 cities for young entrepreneurs starting a 5 business and was named seventh in the *Forbes* list of top 6 "Opportunity Cities," based on its low cost of living, its cultural 7 resources, and the strength of its business community; and

8 WHEREAS, Lubbock has a diverse economy that draws its 9 strength from agribusiness, manufacturing, and oil and gas, as well 10 as from educational and health care services, entertainment, and 11 the largest medical infrastructure in Texas west of I-35; the 12 city's meticulously planned infrastructure has resulted in a 13 low-traffic community with more neighborhood parks per capita than 14 any other city in Texas; and

15 WHEREAS, With the growth of the cotton industry on the 16 High Plains, Lubbock has become one of the world's primary centers 17 for the processing of cottonseed and hybrid-grain sorghum seed; 18 moreover, the region just north of Lubbock has the highest density 19 of cattle in the entire country; Lubbock is now the home of several 20 major award-winning wineries and vineyards that produce more than 21 80 percent of the state's wine grapes; and

22 WHEREAS, Lubbock offers a wealth of cultural and recreational 23 opportunities, including the Lubbock Symphony Orchestra, Ballet 24 Lubbock, the Silent Wings Museum, the Museum and Planetarium of 25 Texas Tech University, the new Buddy Holly Hall, a state-of-the-art 26 performing arts center, and many more; those wanting a glimpse of 27 frontier history can find it in the restored structures at the

National Ranching Heritage Center, a 15-acre site tracing the
evolution of ranch operations, architecture, and the history and
traditions of the cattle industry; the region's history is also
celebrated at the ever-expanding FiberMax Center for Discovery and
the picturesque American Windmill Museum; and

WHEREAS, The talented musicians who have come from the 6 7 Lubbock area include Buddy Holly and the Crickets, Roy Orbison, the 8 Maines family, Virgil Johnson and the Velvets, Waylon Jennings, Mac Davis, Tanya Tucker, Joe Ely, Jimmie Dale Gilmore, Butch Hancock, 9 10 The Flatlanders, Jon Baumann, The Chicks, Flatland Cavalry, and Josh Abbott, as well as Texas Tech alumni John Denver, Pat Green, 11 12 and William Clark Green; their rich and diverse contributions have 13 earned Lubbock recognition as the Music Crossroads of Texas; and

14 WHEREAS, Lubbock's thriving commerce is represented by the 15 largest business federation on the Texas South Plains, the Lubbock 16 Chamber of Commerce, which expands and guards the prosperity of the 17 Lubbock area; and

WHEREAS, Early major achievements propelled by the chamber of 18 19 commerce during more than a century of service include recruiting farmers from out of state to produce crops on the fertile soils of 20 the Llano Estacado, working to bring the railroad to Lubbock, 21 establishing the South Plains Fair, and drafting and delivering to 22 23 the Texas Capitol the application that would result in establishing 24 Texas Technological College, which today is the heart of the Texas Tech University System; and 25

26 WHEREAS, The Lubbock Chamber of Commerce was instrumental in
27 establishing Lubbock Preston Smith International Airport, Reese

Air Force Base, and outstanding transportation infrastructure, and
it was the first chamber of commerce in Texas to introduce an
Association Health Plan for 34 West Texas counties, which became a
model nationwide; and

5 WHEREAS, Among the delegation visiting the Capitol today are 6 members of the Lubbock Chamber of Commerce's 47th Leadership 7 Lubbock Class, who represent the business and community leaders of 8 Lubbock; and

9 WHEREAS, The citizens of Lubbock have truly kept faith with 10 the founders of their West Texas community; renowned for their 11 faith, hospitality, and warmth as well as their hardiness and 12 determination, they have helped to build a vital urban center that 13 serves not only a large part of West Texas but also the surrounding 14 region; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 89th Texas Legislature hereby recognize February 19, 2025, as Lubbock Day at the State Capitol and extend to the members of the visiting delegation and all their fellow citizens sincere appreciation for the bright dusty aura they add to the Lone Star State.
