RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Black History Month is being celebrated in February

2025 in recognition of the rich cultural heritage and significant

3 achievements of African Americans; and

4 WHEREAS, The observance was first conceived by Dr. Carter

5 G. Woodson, a Harvard-educated scholar and the son of former

6 slaves, who saw a need to promote the research and study of African

7 American history at a time when it was overlooked by mainstream

8 historians; in 1926, Dr. Woodson chose the second week of February

9 as Negro History Week, due to the fact that it included the

10 birthdays of Frederick Douglass and Abraham Lincoln, two men of

11 great influence to Black Americans; in 1976, President Gerald

12 R. Ford expanded and formalized the celebration to include the

13 entire month of February and urged citizens to use it as an

14 opportunity "to honor the too-often neglected accomplishments of

15 Black Americans in every area of endeavor throughout our history";

17 WHEREAS, The country has continued to work toward gaining

18 greater understanding of the enormity of African American

19 contributions in all realms; in September 2016, Barack Obama, the

20 first African American president of the United States, helped to

21 inaugurate the National Museum of African American History and

22 Culture, noting the centrality of the African American experience

23 to the American story; at the opening ceremony, former president

24 George W. Bush, who signed the 2003 bill authorizing construction

- 2 demonstration of our commitment to a fuller, more comprehensive
- 3 telling of the nation's story; and

- 6 been made thus far gives hope that our society can continue to move
- 7 forward and embrace change for the betterment of all people; now,
- 8 therefore, be it

- 10 Legislature hereby recognize February 2025 as Black History Month
- 11 and encourage all Texans to take advantage of opportunities for
- 12 learning, reflection, and celebration.
