A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to the practice of barbering and cosmetology.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 1603.0011(a), Occupations Code, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 (a) The practices of barbering and cosmetology consist of
- 7 performing or offering to perform for compensation any of the
- 8 following services:
- 9 (1) treating a person's hair by:
- 10 (A) providing any method of treatment in this
- 11 section as a primary service, including [arranging, beautifying,]
- 12 bleaching, [cleansing,] coloring, cutting, [dressing,] dyeing,
- 13 processing, shaping, singeing, [straightening, styling,] tinting,
- 14 or straightening or waving using reactive chemicals;
- 15 (B) providing a necessary service that is
- 16 preparatory or ancillary to a service under Paragraph (A),
- 17 including bobbing, clipping, cutting, or trimming a person's hair
- 18 or shaving a person's neck with a safety razor; or
- 19 (C) cutting the person's hair as a separate and
- 20 independent service for which a charge is directly or indirectly
- 21 made separately from charges for any other service;
- 22 (2) treating a person's mustache or beard by
- 23 arranging, beautifying, coloring, processing, styling, trimming,
- 24 or shaving with a safety razor;

- 1 (3) cleansing, stimulating, or massaging a person's
- 2 [scalp,] face, neck, shoulders, or arms:
- 3 (A) by hand or by using a device, apparatus, or
- 4 appliance; and
- 5 (B) with or without the use of any cosmetic
- 6 preparation, antiseptic, tonic, lotion, or cream;
- 7 (4) beautifying a person's face, neck, shoulders, or
- 8 arms using a cosmetic preparation, antiseptic, tonic, lotion,
- 9 powder, oil, clay, cream, or appliance;
- 10 (5) administering facial treatments;
- 11 (6) removing superfluous hair from a person's body
- 12 using depilatories, preparations or chemicals, tweezers, or other
- 13 devices or appliances of any kind or description;
- 14 (7) treating a person's nails by:
- 15 (A) cutting, trimming, polishing, tinting,
- 16 coloring, cleansing, manicuring, or pedicuring; or
- 17 (B) attaching false nails; or
- 18 (8) massaging, cleansing, treating, or beautifying a
- 19 person's hands or feet[+ or
- 20 [(9) weaving a person's hair by using any method to
- 21 attach commercial hair to a person's hair or scalp].
- 22 SECTION 2. Section 1603.0012, Occupations Code, is amended
- 23 to read as follows:
- Sec. 1603.0012. SERVICES NOT CONSTITUTING BARBERING OR
- 25 COSMETOLOGY. Barbering and cosmetology do not include:
- 26 (1) threading, which involves removing unwanted hair
- 27 from a person by using a piece of thread that is looped around the

- 1 hair and pulled to remove the hair and includes the incidental
- 2 trimming of eyebrow hair; [ex]
- 3 (2) servicing a person's wig, toupee, or artificial
- 4 hairpiece on a person's head or on a block after the initial retail
- 5 sale in any manner described by Section 1603.0011(a)(1); or
- 6 (3) blow-dry styling, which includes the practice of
- 7 cleansing, conditioning, drying, arranging, curling,
- 8 straightening, or styling hair using only mechanical devices, hair
- 9 sprays, and topical agents, including balms, oils, and serums.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
