## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to complaints filed with the Texas Ethics Commission.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 571.1223, Government Code, is amended to
- 5 read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 571.1223. DISMISSAL OF COMPLAINT FOLLOWING CORRECTED
- 7 OR AMENDED STATEMENT, REGISTRATION, OR REPORT. At any stage of a
- 8 proceeding under this subchapter, the commission shall dismiss a
- 9 complaint to the extent the complaint alleges a statement,
- 10 registration, or report violates a law or rule if:
- 11 (1) the respondent has filed a corrected or amended
- 12 statement, registration, or report before the commission <u>issues a</u>
- 13 final decision on [accepts jurisdiction over] the complaint; and
- 14 (2) the corrected or amended statement, registration,
- 15 or report remedies the alleged violation.
- SECTION 2. Section 571.1241, Government Code, is amended by
- 17 adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:
- 18 <u>(d) If it is determined that the commission has jurisdiction</u>
- 19 over the violation alleged in a complaint, the respondent may bring
- 20 <u>an action in a district court in the county in which the respondent</u>
- 21 resides to review that determination. The respondent must bring
- 22 the action not later than the 90th day after the date the respondent
- 23 receives notice of the determination.
- SECTION 3. Section 571.1242(g), Government Code, is amended

- 1 to read as follows:
- 2 (g) Not later than the 30th [120th] day after the [later of
- 3 the] date the commission receives a respondent's response to notice
- 4 as required by Subsection (a) or (b) [or the respondent's response
- 5 to written questions as required by Subsection (f)], the commission
- 6 shall:
- 7 (1) propose an agreement to the respondent to settle
- 8 the complaint without holding a preliminary hearing; or
- 9 (2) dismiss the complaint.
- 10 SECTION 4. The changes in law made by this Act to Chapter
- 11 571, Government Code, apply only to a complaint filed under that
- 12 chapter on or after the effective date of this Act. A complaint
- 13 filed before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law
- 14 in effect on the date the complaint was filed, and the former law is
- 15 continued in effect for that purpose.
- SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 17 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 18 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 19 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 20 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
