4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 466, Government Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 466.0265 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 466.0265. GAME SUPPORTING TEXAS WORKFORCE COMMISSION
8	CHILD-CARE SERVICES PROGRAM. (a) The commission shall operate an
9	instant-ticket lottery game to benefit the child-care services
10	program administered by the Texas Workforce Commission.
11	(b) The commission shall:
12	(1) determine the ticket price, payout amounts, and
13	manner in which the game is conducted;
14	(2) to the extent practicable, continuously make
15	available for sale tickets to the game; and
16	(3) change the design or theme of the game regularly to
17	ensure the game remains competitive with other instant-ticket
18	lottery games the commission offers.
19	(c) The commission shall market and advertise the lottery
20	game operated under this section in a manner intended to inform the
21	public the game tickets are available for purchase and the game

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proceeds are used to fund the child-care services program

administered by the Texas Workforce Commission. The game tickets

must clearly state the game proceeds are used to benefit the

- 1 child-care services program administered by the Texas Workforce
- 2 Commission. The Texas Workforce Commission may submit
- 3 recommendations to the Texas Lottery Commission relating to the
- 4 marketing and advertising of the game.
- 5 (d) The commission shall encourage each sales agent that
- 6 sells tickets to instant-ticket games or similar types of lottery
- 7 games to sell tickets to the game operated under this section.
- 8 SECTION 2. Section 466.355(b), Government Code, is amended
- 9 to read as follows:
- 10 (b) Money in the state lottery account may be used only for
- 11 the following purposes and shall be distributed as follows:
- 12 (1) the payment of prizes to the holders of winning
- 13 tickets;
- 14 (2) the payment of costs incurred in the operation and
- 15 administration of the lottery, including any fees received by a
- 16 lottery operator, provided that the costs incurred in a fiscal
- 17 biennium may not exceed an amount equal to 12 percent of the gross
- 18 revenue accruing from the sale of tickets in that biennium;
- 19 (3) the establishment of a pooled bond fund, lottery
- 20 prize reserve fund, unclaimed prize fund, and prize payment
- 21 account; and
- 22 (4) the balance, after creation of a reserve
- 23 sufficient to pay the amounts needed or estimated to be needed under
- 24 Subdivisions (1) through (3), to be transferred on or before the
- 25 15th day of each month as follows:
- 26 (A) the portion of the balance attributable to

less than the amount established under the Tax Equity and Fiscal

- 1 \$5 million in prize money in each state fiscal year less any amount

- SECTION 4. (a) Section 466.355, Government Code, as
- 17 amended by this Act, applies only to a transfer from the state
- 18 lottery account made on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 19 (b) The Texas Lottery Commission shall establish and begin
- 20 selling tickets to the lottery game as required by Section
- 21 466.0265, Government Code, as added by this Act, not later than
- 22 March 2, 2026.
- 23 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
