A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the establishment of a program for the issuance of
3	digital identification; authorizing a fee.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subtitle B, Title 7, Transportation Code, is
6	amended by adding Chapter 526 to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 526. DIGITAL IDENTIFICATION PROGRAM
8	Sec. 526.0101. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
9	(1) "Department" and "driver's license" have the
10	meanings assigned by Section 521.001.
11	(2) "Digital identification" includes a digital
12	driver's license, a digital personal identification certificate, a
13	digital handgun license, and a digital hunting or fishing license.
14	(3) "Handgun license" means a license to carry a
15	handgun issued under Subchapter H, Chapter 411, Government Code.
16	(4) "Hunting or fishing license" means a noncommercial
17	hunting or fishing license of any type issued by the Parks and
18	Wildlife Department, including:
19	(A) a hunting license issued under Chapter 42,
20	Parks and Wildlife Code;
21	(B) a fishing license issued under Chapter 46,
22	Parks and Wildlife Code; or
23	(C) a combination hunting and fishing license
24	issued under Chapter 50, Parks and Wildlife Code.

1	Sec. 526.0102. DIGITAL IDENTIFICATION PROGRAM. (a) The
2	department, in consultation with the Parks and Wildlife Department,
3	by rule shall establish a program for the issuance of digital
4	<u>identification.</u>
5	(b) In establishing the digital identification program, the
6	department shall:
7	(1) assess existing department infrastructure and
8	upgrade department infrastructure according to the department's
9	findings;
10	(2) provide a digital identification solution that:
11	(A) is capable of presenting digital
12	identification on a wireless communication device that:
13	(i) must include the information included
14	on a driver's license, as described by Section 521.121(a); and
15	(ii) may include, as applicable:
16	(a) the information included on a
17	handgun license, as required by Subchapter H, Chapter 411,
18	Government Code; and
19	(b) the information included on a
20	hunting or fishing license, as required by the Parks and Wildlife
21	Code, including a stamp or other authorization issued by the Parks
22	and Wildlife Department in connection with the hunting or fishing
23	<u>license;</u>
24	(B) includes an authentication and verification
25	process for a wireless communication device; and
26	(C) may be used in any location regardless of the
27	location's level of wireless connectivity or cellular telephone

- 2 (3) deploy the digital identification solution; and
- 3 (4) implement any procedures necessary to allow law
- 4 enforcement officials to accept digital identification.
- 5 (c) The department may contract with a third party to
- 6 establish the program described by this section if the cost of the
- 7 contract is covered by the fee authorized under Subsection (d).
- 8 (d) The department may charge a fee of not more than \$5 for
- 9 the issuance of digital identification under this section.
- 10 (e) Except as otherwise provided by this subsection or
- 11 federal law, a person shall accept digital identification issued
- 12 under this section as evidence of another person's identity in the
- 13 same manner as a driver's license. Digital identification issued
- 14 under this section may not be used for voting purposes.
- 15 SECTION 2. (a) The Department of Public Safety by rule
- 16 shall establish and implement the digital identification program
- 17 under Chapter 526, Transportation Code, as added by this Act, not
- 18 later than September 1, 2026.
- 19 (b) If before implementing any provision of this Act the
- 20 Department of Public Safety determines that a waiver or
- 21 authorization from a federal agency is necessary for the
- 22 implementation of that provision, the Department of Public Safety
- 23 shall request the waiver or authorization and may delay
- 24 implementing that provision until the waiver or authorization is
- 25 granted.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
