6	adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows:
7	(a-1) The governing body of a municipality by ordinance may
8	provide that the court has:
9	(1) civil jurisdiction for the purpose of enforcing
10	municipal ordinances enacted under Subchapter A, Chapter 214, Local
11	Government Code, or Subchapter E, Chapter 683, Transportation Code;
12	(2) concurrent jurisdiction with a district court or a
13	county court at law under Subchapter B, Chapter 54, Local
14	Government Code, within the municipality's territorial limits and
15	property owned by the municipality located in the municipality's
16	extraterritorial jurisdiction for the purpose of enforcing health
17	and safety and nuisance abatement ordinances; and
18	(3) authority to issue:
19	(A) search warrants for the purpose of
20	investigating a health and safety or nuisance abatement ordinance
21	violation; and
22	(B) seizure warrants for the purpose of securing,
23	removing, or demolishing the offending property and removing the
24	debris from the premises.
