## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to the prosecution of the offense of sexual assault.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 22.011(b), Penal Code, is amended to
- 5 read as follows:
- 6 (b) A sexual assault under Subsection (a)(1) is without the 7 consent of the other person if:
- 8 (1) the actor compels the other person to submit or
- 9 participate by the use of physical force, violence, or coercion;
- 10 (2) the actor compels the other person to submit or
- 11 participate by threatening to use force or violence against the
- 12 other person or to cause harm to the other person, and the other
- 13 person believes that the actor has the present ability to execute
- 14 the threat;
- 15 (3) the other person has not consented and the actor
- 16 knows the other person is unconscious or physically unable to
- 17 resist;
- 18 (4) the actor knows that as a result of mental disease
- 19 or defect the other person is at the time of the sexual assault
- 20 incapable either of appraising the nature of the act or of resisting
- 21 it;
- 22 (5) the other person has not consented and the actor
- 23 knows the other person is unaware that the sexual assault is
- 24 occurring;

- 1 (6) the actor has intentionally impaired the other
- 2 person's power to appraise or control the other person's conduct by
- 3 administering any substance without the other person's knowledge;
- 4 (7) the actor compels the other person to submit or
- 5 participate by threatening to use force or violence against any
- 6 person, and the other person believes that the actor has the ability
- 7 to execute the threat;
- 8 (8) the actor is a public servant who coerces the other
- 9 person to submit or participate;
- 10 (9) the actor is a mental health services provider or a
- 11 health care services provider who causes the other person, who is a
- 12 patient or former patient of the actor, to submit or participate by
- 13 exploiting the other person's emotional dependency on the actor;
- 14 (10) the actor is a clergyman who causes the other
- 15 person to submit or participate by exploiting the other person's
- 16 emotional dependency on the clergyman in the clergyman's
- 17 professional character as spiritual adviser;
- 18 (11) the actor is an employee of a facility where the
- 19 other person is a resident, unless the employee and resident are
- 20 formally or informally married to each other under Chapter 2,
- 21 Family Code;
- 22 (12) the actor is a health care services provider who,
- 23 in the course of performing an assisted reproduction procedure on
- 24 the other person, uses human reproductive material from a donor
- 25 knowing that the other person has not expressly consented to the use
- 26 of material from that donor;
- 27 (13) the actor is a coach or tutor who causes the other

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- 1 person to submit or participate by using the actor's power or
- 2 influence to exploit the other person's dependency on the actor;
- 3 [<del>or</del>]
- 4 (14) the actor is a caregiver hired to assist the other
- 5 person with activities of daily life and causes the other person to
- 6 submit or participate by exploiting the other person's dependency
- 7 on the actor; or
- 8 (15) the actor is a mental health services provider, a
- 9 health care services provider, or a person purporting to be a health
- 10 care services provider who, during the course of providing actual
- 11 or purported mental health services or health care services to the
- 12 other person, causes the other person to submit or participate by
- 13 creating or confirming a false impression of law or fact.
- SECTION 2. Section 22.011(c)(3), Penal Code, is amended to
- 15 read as follows:
- 16 (3) "Health care services provider" means <u>a person who</u>
- 17 is licensed, certified, or otherwise authorized by the laws of this
- 18 state to provide health care services in the ordinary course of
- 19 business or practice of a profession, including:
- 20 (A) a physician licensed under Subtitle B, Title
- 21 3, Occupations Code;
- 22 (B) a chiropractor licensed under Chapter 201,
- 23 Occupations Code;
- 24 (C) a physical therapist licensed under Chapter
- 25 453, Occupations Code;
- 26 (D) a physician assistant licensed under Chapter
- 27 204, Occupations Code; or

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- 1 (E) a registered nurse, a vocational nurse, or an
- 2 advanced practice nurse licensed under Chapter 301, Occupations
- 3 Code.
- 4 SECTION 3. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 5 an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. An
- 6 offense committed before the effective date of this Act is governed
- 7 by the law in effect when the offense was committed, and the former
- 8 law is continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of this
- 9 section, an offense was committed before the effective date of this
- 10 Act if any element of the offense occurred before that date.
- 11 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
