5	SECTION 1. Subchapter E-1, Chapter 1603, Occupations Co	ode,	

is amended by adding Section 1603.2110 to read as follows:

- 7 Sec. 1603.2110. PROHIBITED MEDICAL PRACTICES. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b), a person performing a barbering or 8 9 cosmetology service within the scope of a license or permit issued under this <u>subchapter may not:</u> 10
- 11 (1) make an incision into the dermis layer of a 12 person's skin, including for purposes of injecting a medication or 13 other substance; or
- 14 (2) use a device, as defined by Section 551.003.
- (b) A person holding a license or permit issued under this 15 16 subchapter may perform an act described by Subsection (a) as part of a barbering or cosmetology service if the person is licensed to 17 perform that act in this state or is otherwise authorized by law to 18 perform that act. In a disciplinary action by the department 19 related to an act in violation of Subsection (a), the license or 20 permit holder has the burden of proving by a preponderance of the 21 evidence that the person is licensed or otherwise authorized to 22 23 perform the act.
- 24 (c) This section does not affect the authority of another

- 1 state agency regulating a profession to enforce any law related to
- 2 that profession.
- 3 SECTION 2. Section 1603.2110, Occupations Code, as added by
- 4 this Act, applies only to conduct that occurs on or after the
- 5 effective date of this Act. Conduct that occurs before the
- 6 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the
- 7 date the conduct occurred, and the former law is continued in effect
- 8 for that purpose.
- 9 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
