- 3 SECTION 2. Notwithstanding Section 547.619, Transportation
- 4 Code, as added by this Act, a manufacturer or dealer is not required
- 5 to comply with that section before January 1, 2026.
- 6 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
