A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the participation by non-enrolled students in
- 3 University Interscholastic League-sponsored activities.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 33.0832, Education Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 33.0832. EQUAL OPPORTUNITY FOR CERTAIN STUDENTS TO
- 8 PARTICIPATE IN UNIVERSITY INTERSCHOLASTIC LEAGUE ACTIVITIES. (a)
- 9 In this section:
- 10 (1) "League" means the University Interscholastic
- 11 League.
- 12 (2) "Non-enrolled student" means a student who
- 13 receives instruction as described by Section 29.916(a)(1) from a
- 14 nonpublic school.
- 15 (b) Nothing in this section may be construed to affect the
- 16 holding in Texas Educ. Agency v. Leeper, 893 S.W.2d 432 (Tex. 1994),
- 17 classifying home schools as private schools. The legislature finds
- 18 that a home school is a private school for purposes of this section.
- 19 (c) Except as provided by Subsections (c-2) and (i), a
- 20 public school that participates in an activity sponsored by the
- 21 league shall[may] provide a non-enrolled student, who otherwise
- 22 meets league eligibility standards to represent that school in a
- 23 league activity, with the opportunity to participate in the
- 24 activity on behalf of the school in the same manner that the school

- 1 provides the opportunity to participate to students enrolled in the
- 2 school.
- 3 (c-1) When assigning league classification to a public
- 4 school based on student enrollment, the league must use the same
- 5 student enrollment calculation formula for a school that allows a
- 6 non-enrolled student to participate in a league activity as
- 7 provided by Subsection (c) as the formula used to determine the
- 8 student enrollment of a school that does not allow a non-enrolled
- 9 student to participate in the league activity.
- 10 (c-2) A board of trustees of a school district may decline
- 11 to grant non-enrolled students access to league activities at a
- 12 campus of the district or school by taking a record vote that
- 13 receives the support of a majority of the trustees.
- 14 (d) A non-enrolled student who seeks to participate or
- 15 participates in a league activity on behalf of a school is subject
- 16 to the following relevant policies that apply to students enrolled
- 17 in the school:
- 18 (1) registration for league activities;
- 19 (2) age eligibility;
- 20 (3) fees;
- 21 (4) insurance;
- 22 (5) transportation;
- 23 (6) physical condition;
- 24 (7) qualifications;
- 25 (8) responsibilities;
- 26 (9) event schedules;
- 27 (10) standards of behavior; and

- 1 (11) performance.
- Except as provided by (e-1), a[A] non-enrolled student 2 may only participate in a league activity for the school in the 3 4 school district that the student would be eligible to attend based on the student's residential address. A non-enrolled student who 5 seeks to participate in a league activity on behalf of a school 6 7 shall be required to establish minimum proof of residency acceptable to the district in the same manner as an applicant to 8 9 attend a school in the district under Section 25.001.
- 10 (e-1) If a school has declined to grant non-enrolled
 11 students access to league activities as described in Subsection
 12 (c-2), a non-enrolled student eligible to attend that school based
 13 on their residential address may participate in a league activity
 14 for the public school closest to their residential address that has
 15 not declined to grant non-enrolled students access to league
 16 activities as described by Subsection (c-2).
- 17 (f) The parent or person standing in parental relation to a non-enrolled student is responsible for oversight of academic 18 standards relating to the student's participation in a league 19 20 activity. As a condition of eligibility to participate in a league activity during the first six weeks of a school year, a non-enrolled 21 22 student must demonstrate grade-level academic proficiency on any nationally recognized, norm-referenced assessment instrument, such 23 as the Iowa Test of Basic Skills, Stanford Achievement Test, 24 25 California Achievement Test, or Comprehensive Test of Basic Skills. non-enrolled student demonstrates the required academic 26 27 proficiency by achieving a composite, core, or survey score that is

- 1 within the average or higher than average range of scores, as
- 2 established by the applicable testing service. For purposes of 25
- 3 this subsection, a school district shall accept assessment results
- 4 administered or reported by a third party.
- 5 (g) A non-enrolled student's demonstration of academic
- 6 proficiency under Subsection (f) is sufficient for purposes of that
- 7 subsection for the school year in which the student achieves the
- 8 required score and the subsequent school year.
- 9 (h) After the first six weeks of a school year, the parent or
- 10 person standing in parental relation to a non-enrolled student
- 11 participating in a league activity on behalf of a public school must
- 12 periodically, in accordance with the school's grading calendar,
- 13 provide written verification to the school indicating that the
- 14 student is receiving a passing grade in each course or subject being
- 15 taught.
- 16 (i) A non-enrolled student is not authorized by this section
- 17 to participate in a league activity during the remainder of any
- 18 school year during which the student was previously enrolled in a
- 19 public school.
- 20 (j) The league may not prohibit a non-enrolled student from
- 21 participating in league activities in the manner authorized by this
- 22 section.
- 23 (k) With respect to a non-enrolled student's education
- 24 program, nothing in this section shall be construed to permit an
- 25 agency of this state, a public school district, or any other
- 26 governmental body to exercise control, regulatory authority, or
- 27 supervision over a non-enrolled student or a parent or person

- 1 standing in parental relation to a non-enrolled student beyond the
- 2 control, regulatory authority, or supervision required to
- 3 participate in a league activity.
- 4 (1) Subject only to eligibility requirements under this
- 5 section for a non-enrolled student to participate in a league
- 6 activity:
- 7 (1) the curriculum or assessment requirements,
- 8 performance standards, practices, or creed of the education program
- 9 provided to a non-enrolled student may not be required to be changed
- 10 in order for the non-enrolled student to participate in a league
- 11 activity; and
- 12 (2) for a non-enrolled student participating in an 26
- 13 education program on January 1, 2021, the education program
- 14 provided to that student may not be required to comply with any
- 15 state law or agency rule relating to that education program unless
- 16 the law or rule was in effect on January 1, 2021.
- 17 (m) Notwithstanding any other law, a non-enrolled student
- 18 who participates in a league activity under this section is subject
- 19 to the immunization requirements and exceptions of Section 38.001
- 20 in the same manner as a public school student.
- 21 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2025-2026
- 22 school year.
- 23 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 25 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 27 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
