A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to qualifications for a sheriff or constable or a 3 candidate for sheriff or constable. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Sections 85.0011(b) and (c), Local Government Code, are amended to read as follows: 6 7 A person is not eligible to serve as sheriff unless the (b) person: 8 (1) has a high school diploma or a high school 9 equivalency certificate; and 10 (2) 11 either: 12 (A) holds an active permanent peace officer 13 license under Chapter 1701, Occupations Code; or is eligible to be licensed under Sections 14 (B) 1701.309 and 1701.312, Occupations Code, obtains a license 15 described by Paragraph (A) within the time provided by Section 16 1701.302(a), Occupations Code, and: 17 18 (i) has a minimum of five years of experience as a federal special investigator; or 19 (ii) is a military veteran with a minimum of 20 21 10 years of combined active duty or national guard service 22 experience. (c) A person is not eligible to be a candidate for the office 23 24 of sheriff unless the person:

No. 428 1 (1) holds an active permanent peace officer license 2 under Chapter 1701, Occupations Code; [-7] or 3 (2) is a person described by Subsection (b)(2)(B)(i) or (ii) and intends to obtain [obtains] a license described by 4 5 Subdivision (1) within the time provided by Section 1701.302(a), Occupations Code. 6 7 SECTION 2. Subchapter A, Chapter 86, Local Government Code, 8 is amended by adding Section 86.0025 to read as follows: Sec. 86.0025. QUALIFICATIONS FOR CONSTABLE OR CANDIDATE FOR 9 CONSTABLE. (a) In this section, "active duty," "federal special 10 investigator," and "military veteran" have the meanings assigned by 11 12 Section 85.0011. (b) A person is not eligible to serve as constable unless 13 14 the person: 15 (1) has a high school diploma or a high school equivalency certificate; and 16 17 (2) either: (A) holds an active permanent peace officer 18 19 license under Chapter 1701, Occupations Code; or (B) is eligible to be licensed under Sections 20 1701.309 and 1701.312, Occupations Code, obtains a license 21 described by Paragraph (A) within the time provided by Section 22 1701.302(a), Occupations Code, and: 23 24 (i) has a minimum of five years of experience as a federal special investigator; or 25 26 (ii) is a military veteran with a minimum of 10 years of combined active duty or national guard service

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1 <u>experience</u>.

2 (c) A person is not eligible to be a candidate for the office
3 of constable unless the person:

4 (1) holds an active permanent peace officer license
5 under Chapter 1701, Occupations Code; or

6 (2) is a person described by Subsection (b)(2)(B)(i)
7 or (ii) and intends to obtain a license described by Subdivision (1)
8 within the time provided by Section 1701.302(a), Occupations Code.

9 SECTION 3. Section 1701.302(a), Occupations Code, is 10 amended to read as follows:

(a) Except as provided by <u>Sections 85.0011(b)(2)(A) and</u> <u>86.0025(b)(2)(A)</u> [Section 85.0011], Local Government Code, an officer, including a sheriff <u>and constable</u>, elected under the Texas Constitution or a statute or appointed to fill a vacancy in an elective office must obtain a license from the commission not later than the second anniversary of the date the officer takes office.

17 SECTION 4. Section 86.0021, Local Government Code, is 18 repealed.

19 SECTION 5. The changes in law made by this Act do not apply 20 to a sheriff or constable serving a term that began before the 21 effective date of this Act. A sheriff or constable serving a term 22 that began before the effective date of this Act is governed for the 23 remainder of that term by the law as it existed immediately before 24 the effective date of this Act, and that law is continued in effect 25 for that purpose.

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SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.

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
