## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the establishment of a property value study hardship
3	grant program.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter F, Chapter 48, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 48.282 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 48.282. PROPERTY VALUE STUDY HARDSHIP GRANTS. (a) For
8	the 2025-2026 and 2026-2027 school years, from money appropriated
9	for purposes of this section, the commissioner may administer a
10	grant program to provide grants to eligible school districts to
11	offset a reduction in the district's funding under the Foundation
12	School Program resulting from the use of the state value for the
13	district's taxable value of property as provided by Section
14	403.302(c), Government Code, for the 2024 and 2025 tax years.
15	(b) The amount of a grant awarded under this section is the
16	difference, if that difference is greater than zero, between:
17	(1) the funding the school district would have
18	received under Chapter 46, this chapter, and Chapter 49 for the
19	applicable school year if the local value for the district's
20	taxable value of property was used for the applicable tax year; and
21	(2) the funding to which the district is entitled
22	under Chapter 46, this chapter, and Chapter 49 for the applicable
23	school year.

(c) An open-enrollment charter school is not eligible to

- 1 receive a grant under this section.
- 2 (d) Funding provided to a school district under this section
- 3 is in addition to all other funding provided under Chapter 46, this
- 4 chapter, and Chapter 49.
- 5 (e) The commissioner may require a school district to
- 6 submit, or request from a state agency or a political subdivision of
- 7 this state, additional information as needed to make a
- 8 determination under this section.
- 9 (f) The total amount of grants awarded under this section
- 10 for a school year may not exceed \$175 million.
- 11 (g) In awarding grants under this section, the commissioner
- 12 shall prioritize school districts experiencing the greatest
- 13 percentage reduction in funding described by Subsection (a).
- 14 (h) The commissioner may not adjust the amount of a grant
- 15 <u>awarded under this section based on data revisions received after</u>
- 16 the grant has been awarded.
- 17 (i) A determination by the commissioner under this section
- 18 is final and may not be appealed.
- (j) This section expires September 1, 2027.
- 20 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
