## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to portable generator safety and warning labels. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Subtitle A, Title 9, Health and Safety Code, is 4 5 amended by adding Chapter 761 to read as follows: 6 CHAPTER 761. PORTABLE GENERATOR SAFETY Sec. 761.001. WARNING LABEL REQUIRED. (a) A manufacturer 7 who produces or distributes for retail sale in this state a portable 8 9 generator without a carbon-monoxide kill switch installed on the generator shall place a warning label on the generator and the 10 generator's packaging notifying consumers of the risk of carbon 11 monoxide poisoning and providing information on the safe operation 12 13 of the generator. 14 (b) A retailer who offers for sale or resale a portable generator shall ensure any generator subject to Subsection (a) 15 16 complies with the warning label requirements. (c) The commissioner of insurance by rule shall prescribe 17 the requirements for the warning label required by this section. 18 Sec. 761.002. CIVIL ACTION. (a) A manufacturer or retailer 19 who violates Section 761.001 is liable in a civil action for 20 personal injury, death, or other damages caused to a person by the 21 22 violation. 23 (b) A person who prevails in an action against a manufacturer or retailer under this section is entitled to obtain: 24

| 13 | SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only          |
| 14 | to a cause of action that accrues on or after the effective date of |
| 15 | this Act.   |
| 16 | SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.                 |
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
