- 2 relating to the confidentiality of certain home address information

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 25.025(a), Tax Code, as amended by
- 6 Chapters 76 (S.B. 617), 152 (S.B. 870), 430 (H.B. 1911), 765 (H.B.
- 7 4504), and 937 (S.B. 1525), Acts of the 88th Legislature, Regular
- 8 Session, 2023, is reenacted and amended to read as follows:
- 9 (a) This section applies only to:
- 10 (1) a current or former peace officer as defined by
- 11 Article 2A.001, Code of Criminal Procedure, and the spouse or
- 12 surviving spouse of the peace officer;

- 14 Subchapter A or B, Chapter 7B, Code of Criminal Procedure, or a
- 15 magistrate's order for emergency protection issued under Article
- 16 17.292, Code of Criminal Procedure; or
- 17 (B) other independent documentary evidence
- 18 necessary to show that the individual, the individual's child, or
- 19 another person in the individual's household is a victim of sexual
- 20 assault or abuse, stalking, or trafficking of persons;
- 21 (8) a participant in the address confidentiality
- 22 program administered by the attorney general under Subchapter B,
- 23 Chapter 58, Code of Criminal Procedure, who provides proof of
- 24 certification under Article 58.059, Code of Criminal Procedure;
- 25 (9) a federal judge, a federal bankruptcy judge, a
- 26 marshal of the United States Marshals Service, a state judge, or a
- 27 family member of a federal judge, a federal bankruptcy judge, a

- 1 marshal of the United States Marshals Service, or a state judge;
- 2 (10) a current or former district attorney, criminal
- 3 district attorney, or county or municipal attorney whose
- 4 jurisdiction includes any criminal law or child protective services
- 5 matters;
- 6 (11) a current or former employee of a district
- 7 attorney, criminal district attorney, or county or municipal
- 8 attorney whose jurisdiction includes any criminal law or child
- 9 protective services matters;
- 10 (12) an officer or employee of a community supervision
- 11 and corrections department established under Chapter 76,
- 12 Government Code, who performs a duty described by Section 76.004(b)
- 13 of that code;
- 14 (13) a criminal investigator of the United States as
- 15 described by Article 2A.002(a), Code of Criminal Procedure;
- 16 (14) a current or honorably retired police officer or
- 17 inspector of the United States Federal Protective Service;
- 18 (15) a current or former United States attorney,
- 19 assistant United States attorney, federal public defender, deputy
- 20 federal public defender, or assistant federal public defender and
- 21 the spouse and child of the attorney or public defender;
- 22 (16) a current or former employee of the office of the

- 8 Juvenile Justice Department or of the predecessors in function of

- 10 (20) a current or former juvenile probation or
- 11 supervision officer certified by the Texas Juvenile Justice
- 12 Department, or the predecessors in function of the department,
- 13 under Title 12, Human Resources Code;
- 14 (21) a current or former employee of a juvenile
- 15 justice program or facility, as those terms are defined by Section
- 16 261.405, Family Code;
- 17 (22) a current or former employee of the Texas Civil
- 18 Commitment Office or the predecessor in function of the office or a
- 19 division of the office;
- 20 (23) a current or former employee of a federal judge or
- 21 state judge;
- 22 (24) a current or former child protective services
- 23 caseworker, adult protective services caseworker, or investigator
- 24 for the Department of Family and Protective Services or a current or
- 25 former employee of a department contractor performing child
- 26 protective services caseworker, adult protective services
- 27 caseworker, or investigator functions for the contractor on behalf

- 2 (25) an elected public officer;
- 3 (26) a firefighter or volunteer firefighter or
- 4 emergency medical services personnel as defined by Section 773.003,
- 5 Health and Safety Code;
- 6 (27) a customs and border protection officer or border
- 7 patrol agent of United States Customs and Border Protection or the
- 8 spouse, surviving spouse, or adult child of a customs and border
- 9 protection officer or border patrol agent;
- 10 (28) [(27) a current or former attorney for the
- 11 Department of Family and Protective Services
- $[\frac{(27)}{}]$ a current or former employee or contract staff
- 13 member of a university health care provider at a corrections
- 14 facility operated by the Texas Department of Criminal Justice or
- 15 the Texas Juvenile Justice Department; [and]
- (29) $\left[\frac{(28)}{(28)}\right]$ a current or former attorney for the
- 17 Department of Family and Protective Services; and

- 20 SECTION 2. To the extent of any conflict, this Act prevails
- 21 over another Act of the 89th Legislature, Regular Session, 2025,
- 22 relating to nonsubstantive additions to and corrections in enacted
- 23 codes.
- 24 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 25 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 26 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 27 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
