- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Sections 162.005(b) and (c), Family Code, are
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 (b) Before placing a child for adoption, the Department of
 7 Family and Protective Services, a licensed child-placing agency, or
 8 the child's parent or guardian shall compile a report on the
 9 available health, social, educational, and genetic history of the
 10 child to be adopted and distribute the report as required by this
- 12 (c) The department shall ensure that each licensed child-placing agency, single source continuum contractor, or other person placing a child for adoption receives a copy of any portion of the report prepared by the department not later than the 30th day
- 15 of the report prepared by the department <u>not later than the 30th day</u>
- 16 after the date the child's permanency plan is changed to include
- 17 adoption.

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- SECTION 2. Section 162.0062, Family Code, is amended by
- 19 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsections (a-2) and (a-3) to
- 20 read as follows:
- 21 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (c), the prospective
- 22 adoptive parents of a child are entitled to examine the records and
- 23 other information relating to the history of the child, including
- 24 confidential information other than the identity of the biological

- 1 parents and any other person whose identity is confidential. The
- 2 Department of Family and Protective Services, licensed
- 3 child-placing agency, or other person placing a child for adoption
- 4 shall inform the prospective adoptive parents of their right to
- 5 examine the records and other information relating to the history
- 6 of the child. The department, licensed child-placing agency, or
- 7 other person placing the child for adoption shall:
- 8 (1) redact each social security number from the
- 9 records and information; and
- 10 (2) edit the records and information to protect the
- 11 identity of the biological parents, any biological siblings adopted
- 12 by a different family, the adoptive parents of those biological
- 13 siblings, any person who made a report of abuse or neglect to the
- 14 department or a law enforcement agency, and any [other] person
- 15 whose identity is confidential <u>under Section 262.308</u>.
- 16 <u>(a-2)</u> A prospective adoptive parent must sign a
- 17 nondisclosure agreement before the department, licensed
- 18 child-placing agency, or other person placing the child for
- 19 adoption may release confidential information under this section.
- 20 <u>(a-3)</u> The department, licensed child-placing agency, or
- 21 other person placing the child for adoption shall provide the
- 22 information under this section not later than the 90th day after the
- 23 <u>date the information is requested.</u>
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
