

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

1  
2 relating to the issuance of a driver's license to certain persons  
3 that includes an alternative to the license holder's residence  
4 address.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. The heading to Section 521.1211, Transportation  
7 Code, is amended to read as follows:

8 Sec. 521.1211. DRIVER'S LICENSE FOR PAROLE OFFICERS, PEACE  
9 OFFICERS, PROBATION OFFICERS, AND PROSECUTORS.

10 SECTION 2. Sections 521.1211(a), (a-1), (d), and (f),  
11 Transportation Code, are amended to read as follows:

12 (a) In this section:

13 (1) "Parole officer" has the meaning assigned by  
14 Section 508.001, Government Code.

15 (1-a) "Peace officer" has the meaning assigned by  
16 Article 2A.001, Code of Criminal Procedure, except that the term  
17 includes a special investigator as defined by Article 2A.002, Code  
18 of Criminal Procedure.

19 (2) "Probation officer" means a law enforcement  
20 professional that supervises individuals placed on probation.

21 (3) "Prosecutor" means a county attorney, district  
22 attorney, criminal district attorney, assistant county attorney,  
23 assistant district attorney, or assistant criminal district  
24 attorney.

1 (a-1) This section applies only to a parole officer, a peace  
2 officer, a probation officer, and a prosecutor.

3 (d) If the holder of a driver's license that includes an  
4 alternative address moves to a new residence, or, for a parole  
5 officer, a probation officer, or a prosecutor, to a new office  
6 address, or if the name of the person is changed by marriage or  
7 otherwise, the license holder shall, not later than the 30th day  
8 after the date of the address or name change, notify the department  
9 and provide the department with the number of the person's driver's  
10 license and, as applicable, the person's:

11 (1) former and new addresses; or

12 (2) former and new names.

13 (f) The department shall accept as an alternative address:

14 (1) for a parole officer, the address of an office of  
15 the parole officer;

16 (2) for a peace officer, an address that is in the:

17 (A) municipality or county of the peace officer's  
18 residence; or

19 (B) county of the peace officer's place of  
20 employment; ~~and~~

21 (3) for a probation officer, the address of an office  
22 of the probation officer; and

23 (4) ~~(2)~~ for a prosecutor, the address of an office  
24 of the prosecutor.

25 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
