## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to requiring public institutions of higher education to
3	post information regarding the compensation of certain employees
4	and independent contractors on the institution's Internet website.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subchapter ${\tt Z}$ , Chapter ${\tt 51}$ , Education Code, is
7	amended by adding Section 51.9612 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 51.9612. REQUIRED POSTING OF CERTAIN EMPLOYEE AND
9	INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR COMPENSATION. (a) In this section,
10	"institution of higher education" has the meaning assigned by
11	Section 61.003.
12	(b) Subject to Subsection (c), not later than December 1 of
13	each year, each institution of higher education shall post on the
14	institution's Internet website a report that discloses the name and
15	compensation of each institution employee or independent
16	contractor whose combined salary and other compensation, or payment
17	for services performed for the institution as an independent
18	contractor, as applicable, exceeds \$100,000 per year. The report
19	must:
20	(1) present the information in the same format as ar
21	administrative accountability report on compensation provided to
22	high-ranking administrative employees required to be submitted to
23	the Legislative Budget Board under the General Appropriations Act,
24	if any; and

- 1 (2) be accessible through a conspicuous link on the
- 2 institution's Internet website home page.
- 3 (c) The commissioner of higher education may grant an
- 4 institution of higher education an exemption from disclosing the
- 5 name and compensation of an employee or independent contractor in
- 6 the report required under Subsection (b) if the commissioner
- 7 determines that:
- 8 (1) the information is confidential under applicable
- 9 state or federal law; or
- 10 (2) disclosure of the information poses a substantial
- 11 risk of placing the institution at a serious competitive
- 12 <u>disadvantage</u>.
- 13 (d) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board may adopt
- 14 rules as necessary to implement this section.
- SECTION 2. Not later than December 1, 2025, each public
- 16 institution of higher education shall post on its Internet website
- 17 the initial report required by Section 51.9612, Education Code, as
- 18 added by this Act.
- 19 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 20 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 21 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 22 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 23 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
