4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subtitle B, Title 13, Occupations Code, is
6	amended by adding Chapter 2053 to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 2053. NAME, IMAGE, AND LIKENESS AGREEMENTS
8	Sec. 2053.001. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "student
9	athlete" means an individual who as a student participates in:
10	(1) a University Interscholastic League activity; or
11	(2) an intercollegiate athletic program at an
12	institution of higher education.
13	Sec. 2053.002. PROHIBITED NAME, IMAGE, AND LIKENESS
14	AGREEMENTS. A person may not enter into an agreement with a student
15	athlete under which the person:
16	(1) pays the student athlete an amount as
17	<pre>consideration;</pre>
18	(2) receives the exclusive right to negotiate the use
19	or sale of the student athlete's name, image, and likeness for the
20	term of the agreement; and
21	(3) is entitled to receive a percentage of earnings
22	from the use or sale of the student athlete's name, image, and
23	likeness until the earlier of:
24	(A) the date the person has received a

1	predetermined amount of the student athlete's earnings; or
2	(B) the date the agreement expires.
3	Sec. 2053.003. PROHIBITED AGREEMENTS VOID AND
4	UNENFORCEABLE. An agreement entered into in violation of Section
5	2053.002 or any language in an agreement that circumvents the
6	prohibition imposed under that section or otherwise achieves the
7	same or a substantially similar effect as a prohibited agreement is
8	void and unenforceable.
9	Sec. 2053.004. PROHIBITED WAIVER. An agreement may not
10	waive the requirements of this chapter. A purported waiver of this
11	chapter is a violation of this section and is void.
12	Sec. 2053.005. CIVIL PENALTY; INJUNCTIVE RELIEF. (a) A
13	person who violates this chapter is liable for a civil penalty not
14	to exceed \$100,000 for each violation.
15	(b) The attorney general may bring an action in the name of
16	this state to:
17	(1) recover a civil penalty under Subsection (a);
18	(2) restrain or enjoin the person from violating this
19	chapter; or
20	(3) recover the civil penalty under Subsection (a) and
21	seek injunctive relief.
22	(c) The attorney general may recover reasonable attorney's
23	fees and court costs in bringing an action under this section.
24	SECTION 2. Chapter 2053, Occupations Code, as added by this
25	Act, applies only to an agreement entered into on or after the
26	effective date of this Act.
27	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
