## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

## AN ACT

2 relating to the notification of a peace officer through an 3 indication associated with vehicle registration that a person has a 4 health condition or disability that may impede effective 5 communication.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 502.061, Transportation Code, is amended by amending Subsections (a) and (b) and adding Subsection (b-1) to read as follows:

(a) An application for registration must provide space for the applicant to voluntarily indicate that the applicant has a health condition or disability that may impede effective communication with a peace officer. The department may request from a person who makes an indication under this subsection verification of a condition in the form of <u>a written statement from</u>, as appropriate for the person's condition or disability, a [+

19 [(2) for a mental health condition, a written 20 statement from a licensed physician, a] licensed psychologist, [or 21 a] non-physician mental health professional, as defined by Section 22 571.003, Health and Safety Code, speech-language pathologist, 23 occupational therapist, audiologist, school psychologist, or other 24 health care provider.

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1	(b) For each person who voluntarily indicated on an
2	application under Subsection (a) that the person has a health
3	condition or disability that may impede effective communication,
4	<u>the</u> [ <del>The</del> ] department shall <u>:</u>
5	(1) provide to the Department of Public Safety the
6	vehicle registration information of the person; and
7	(2) inform the Department of Public Safety whether the
8	person's health condition or disability is categorized as:
9	(A) a speech or language impairment;
10	(B) a hearing impairment; or
11	(C) autism spectrum disorder.
12	(b-1) Except as provided by Subsection (b), the [a person
13	who voluntarily indicated on an application under Subsection (a)
14	that the person has a health condition or disability that may impede
15	effective communication. The] department may not provide to the
16	Department of Public Safety information that shows the type of
17	health condition or disability a person has.
18	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.

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
