## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to Holocaust education and training provided to students
- 3 enrolled at public schools and public institutions of higher
- 4 education.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 8, Education Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Section 8.065 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 8.065. COLLABORATION WITH HOLOCAUST MUSEUMS. Each
- 9 regional education service center shall on a regular basis
- 10 collaborate with one or more of the Holocaust museums in this state
- 11 to expand educator training and classroom education opportunities
- 12 regarding Holocaust education.
- SECTION 2. Section 29.9072, Education Code, is amended by
- 14 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsections (d), (e), and (f) to
- 15 read as follows:
- 16 (a) In this section, "Holocaust" has the meaning assigned by
- 17 Section 448.001 [449.001], Government Code.
- 18 (d) Not later than June 1 of each school year, each school
- 19 district and open-enrollment charter school shall submit to the
- 20 agency a report regarding the Holocaust Remembrance Week
- 21 instruction offered by the district or school for that school year
- 22 under this section. The report must include the activities,
- 23 lessons, and instructional materials used for the instruction.
- (e) As soon as practicable after June 1 of each school year,

- 1 the agency shall compile all reports submitted under Subsection (d)
- 2 for the school year and submit the compiled information to each
- 3 regional education service center and the Texas Holocaust,
- 4 Genocide, and Antisemitism Advisory Commission.
- 5 (f) Not later than 60 days before the first day of the week
- 6 designated by the governor as Holocaust Remembrance Week, the
- 7 agency shall provide notice to each school district and
- 8 open-enrollment charter school of the week to be known as Holocaust
- 9 Remembrance Week in public schools, including the instruction and
- 10 reporting requirements under Subsections (c) and (d).
- 11 SECTION 3. Subchapter Z, Chapter 29, Education Code, is
- 12 amended by adding Section 29.90721 to read as follows:
- 13 Sec. 29.90721. HOLOCAUST REMEMBRANCE WEEK GRANT PROGRAM.
- 14 (a) In this section:
- 15 (1) "Advisory commission" means the Texas Holocaust,
- 16 Genocide, and Antisemitism Advisory Commission.
- 17 (2) "Commission" means the Texas Historical
- 18 Commission.
- 19 (3) "Holocaust" has the meaning assigned by Section
- 20 448.001, Government Code.
- 21 (b) From money appropriated, received from gifts, grants,
- 22 or donations, or otherwise available for purposes of this section,
- 23 the commission, in coordination with the advisory commission, shall
- 24 establish and administer a grant program to provide grants to
- 25 school districts and museums, centers, and other relevant
- 26 organizations in this state to assist in the implementation of
- 27 Holocaust Remembrance Week instruction under Section 29.9072. The

- 1 <u>commission may award a grant for purposes of:</u>
- 2 (1) developing optional, age-appropriate lesson plans
- 3 for classroom teachers who lack relevant subject matter expertise
- 4 regarding the Holocaust;
- 5 (2) sponsoring student field trips to the Holocaust
- 6 museums in this state, with priority given to campuses in urban and
- 7 rural districts;
- 8 (3) providing training approved by the advisory
- 9 commission for educators and for administrators who manage
- 10 professional development and teacher training in each district;
- 11 (4) cataloging and expanding relevant audiovisual and
- 12 digital classroom resources, including resources maintained by
- 13 Holocaust museums in this state; and
- 14 (5) developing, in collaboration with museums,
- 15 bilingual curricula to meet the needs of more students in this state
- 16 and making the curricula available on the advisory commission's
- 17 Internet website.
- 18 (c) The commission, in coordination with the advisory
- 19 commission, shall adopt rules as necessary to establish and
- 20 administer the grant program under this section.
- 21 SECTION 4. Subchapter C, Chapter 61, Education Code, is
- 22 amended by adding Section 61.0767 to read as follows:
- 23 <u>Sec. 61.0767. EDUCATOR PREPARATION PILOT PROGRAM TO IMPROVE</u>
- 24 DELIVERY OF HOLOCAUST EDUCATION. (a) The board shall establish a
- 25 pilot program at institutions of higher education selected by the
- 26 board to train students enrolled in an educator preparation program
- 27 to provide more effective instruction related to the history and

- 1 remembrance of the Holocaust. The board may adopt rules as
- 2 necessary to administer this section.
- 3 (b) An institution of higher education selected under this
- 4 section must have an educator preparation program approved by the
- 5 State Board for Educator Certification or be affiliated with a
- 6 program approved by the State Board for Educator Certification.
- 7 (c) At least 50 percent of the institutions of higher
- 8 education selected by the board must be located in an area or likely
- 9 to graduate educators who will teach in a public school in an area
- 10 where the applicable school district has demonstrated low
- 11 participation in Holocaust Remembrance Week instruction.
- 12 (d) The board shall collaborate with the Texas Holocaust,
- 13 Genocide, and Antisemitism Advisory Commission to establish
- 14 minimum curriculum requirements, guidelines, and procedures
- 15 necessary for the implementation of the pilot program.
- 16 (e) The board shall use any funds appropriated or otherwise
- 17 made available for purposes of the pilot program and may accept
- 18 gifts, grants, and donations to fund the pilot program.
- 19 (f) The pilot program shall operate for four full academic
- 20 years.
- 21 (g) An institution of higher education selected for the
- 22 pilot program shall annually report to the board in the manner
- 23 prescribed by the board data and information regarding the
- 24 operation of the pilot program.
- 25 (h) The report required by Subsection (g) must contain, with
- 26 respect to the preceding academic year:
- 27 (1) a description of the manner in which the selected

- 1 institution complied with the purpose of the pilot program and any
- 2 difficulties encountered in complying with that purpose, including
- 3 timelines related to implementing the pilot program;
- 4 (2) data regarding the institution's students
- 5 receiving instruction under the pilot program through an educator
- 6 preparation program;
- 7 (3) information regarding any third-party entities or
- 8 organizations the institution collaborates with to deliver
- 9 instruction under the pilot program through an educator preparation
- 10 program; and
- 11 (4) a survey of educator preparation program students
- 12 and faculty who participated in the pilot program at the
- 13 institution, including feedback regarding the results of the pilot
- 14 program and information regarding the marketability and subsequent
- 15 teaching careers of participating students.
- 16 (i) The board shall compile a biennial report based on the
- 17 data and information received under Subsection (g) regarding the
- 18 operation of the pilot program and the results of the survey of
- 19 educator preparation program students and faculty who participated
- 20 in the pilot program at each of the selected institutions during the
- 21 preceding biennium. Not later than September 1 of each
- 22 odd-numbered year, the board shall deliver a copy of the report to
- 23 the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of
- 24 representatives, and the chair of each standing committee of the
- 25 legislature having primary jurisdiction over higher education.
- 26 <u>(j) The biennial report produced by the board before</u>
- 27 September 1, 2029, must include a recommendation regarding whether

- 1 the pilot program should be continued, expanded, or terminated.
- 2 (k) Before September 1, 2031, the board shall conduct a
- 3 final survey of educator preparation program students and faculty
- 4 who participated in the pilot program at the selected institutions
- 5 at any time during the operation of the program, including feedback
- 6 regarding the results of the pilot program and information
- 7 regarding the marketability and teaching careers of participating
- 8 students. The board shall publish the results of the survey on its
- 9 Internet website.
- 10 (1) The pilot program concludes and this section expires
- 11 <u>December 1, 2031.</u>
- 12 SECTION 5. Section 29.9072, Education Code, as amended by
- 13 this Act, applies beginning with the 2025-2026 school year.
- 14 SECTION 6. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 15 of this Act, the Texas Historical Commission, in coordination with
- 16 the Texas Holocaust, Genocide, and Antisemitism Advisory
- 17 Commission, shall establish the grant program required by Section
- 18 29.90721, Education Code, as added by this Act.
- 19 SECTION 7. The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board
- 20 shall select public institutions of higher education for the pilot
- 21 program required under Section 61.0767, Education Code, as added by
- 22 this Act, not later than May 1, 2026.
- 23 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
