- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 37.0811(c) and (d), Education Code, are
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (c) A school marshal appointed by the board of trustees of a
- 8 school district or the governing body of an open-enrollment charter
- 9 school may carry [a concealed handgun] or possess a handgun on the
- 10 physical premises of a school, but only:
- 11 (1) in the manner provided by written regulations
- 12 adopted by the board of trustees or the governing body; and
- 13 (2) at a specific school as specified by the board of
- 14 trustees or governing body, as applicable.
- 15 (d) Any written regulations adopted for purposes of

- 17 (1) provide that a school marshal may:
- 18 <u>(A)</u> carry a concealed handgun on the school
- 19 marshal's person<u>;</u>
- 20 (B) if wearing a uniform identifying the marshal

- (C) possess the handgun on the physical premises
- 24 of a school in a locked and secured safe or other locked and secured

- 11 Chapters 795 (H.B. 781) and 851 (S.B. 741), Acts of the 87th
- 12 Legislature, Regular Session, 2021, is reenacted and amended to

- 14 (e) Any written regulations adopted for purposes of

- 1 duty ammunition approved for that purpose by the Texas Commission
- 2 on Law Enforcement; and
- 3 $\underline{(3)}$ [$\frac{(2)}{(2)}$] may not require a school marshal to store
- 4 the handgun in a locked container while on duty.
- 5 SECTION 5. This Act applies beginning with the 2025-2026
- 6 school year.
- 7 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
