A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to instruction on adoption in the parenting and paternity
3	awareness program in public schools.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Sections $28.002(p)$ and $(p-2)$, Education Code,
6	are amended to read as follows:
7	(p) The State Board of Education, in conjunction with the
8	office of the attorney general, shall develop a parenting and
9	paternity awareness program that a school district shall use in the
10	district's high school health curriculum. A school district may
11	use the program developed under this subsection in the district's
12	middle or junior high school curriculum. At the discretion of the
13	district, a teacher may modify the suggested sequence and pace of
14	the program at any grade level. The program must:
15	(1) address parenting skills and responsibilities,
16	including child support and other legal rights and responsibilities
17	that come with parenthood;
18	(2) include information related to adoption,
19	<pre>including information about:</pre>
20	(A) the differences between private adoption and
21	<pre>foster care;</pre>
22	(B) the process for adopting a child privately or
23	through the state foster care system; and
24	(C) adoption as an alternative to becoming a

1 parent and the process for placing a child for adoption;

- 2 <u>(3)</u> address relationship skills, including money
- 3 management, communication skills, and marriage preparation; and
- 4 (4) (4) (3) in district middle, junior high, or high
- 5 schools that do not have a family violence prevention program,
- 6 address skills relating to the prevention of family violence.
- 7 (p-2) A school district may develop or adopt research-based
- 8 programs and curriculum materials for use in conjunction with the
- 9 program developed under Subsection (p). The programs and
- 10 curriculum materials may provide instruction in:
- 11 (1) child development;
- 12 (2) parenting skills, including child abuse and
- 13 neglect prevention; [and]
- 14 (3) the information regarding adoption described by
- 15 Subsection (p)(2); and
- 16 (4) assertiveness skills to prevent teenage
- 17 pregnancy, abusive relationships, and family violence.
- SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2025-2026
- 19 school year.
- 20 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 21 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 22 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 23 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 24 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
