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## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 1 AN ACT
- 2 relating to a pilot program for the safe disposal of prescription
- 3 drugs, including controlled substance prescription drugs.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 442A.001, Health and Safety Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 442A.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
- 8 (1) "Collection receptacle" means a receptacle as
- 9 described by 21 C.F.R. Section 1317.75 ["Board" means the Texas
- 10 State Board of Pharmacy].
- 11 (2) "Commission" means the Health and Human Services
- 12 Commission.
- 13 (3) "Controlled substance" has the meaning assigned by
- 14 Section 481.002.
- 15 (4) "Department" means the Department of State Health
- 16 Services.
- 17  $\underline{(5)}$  [ $\underline{(3)}$ ] "Pharmacy" means a facility licensed under
- 18 Chapter 560, Occupations Code.
- 19  $\underline{\text{(6)}}$  [ $\frac{\text{(4)}}{\text{(1)}}$ ] "Pilot program" means the prescription drug
- 20 safe disposal pilot program established under this chapter.
- 21  $\underline{(7)}$  [ $\overline{(5)}$ ] "Prescription drug" has the meaning
- 22 assigned by Section 551.003, Occupations Code.
- 23 (8) [(6)] "Ultimate user" has the meaning assigned by
- 24 21 U.S.C. Section 802.

- 1 SECTION 2. Section 442A.002, Health and Safety Code, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 Sec. 442A.002. PRESCRIPTION DRUG SAFE DISPOSAL PILOT
- 4 PROGRAM. The executive commissioner of the commission [board] by
- 5 rule shall develop and implement a prescription drug safe disposal
- 6 pilot program administered by the department to increase the number
- 7 of <u>collection receptacles</u> [<del>locations</del>] in this state where unused,
- 8 unwanted, or expired prescription drugs are collected from the
- 9 public for safe disposal.
- 10 SECTION 3. Section 442A.051, Health and Safety Code, is
- 11 amended to read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 442A.051. PHARMACY ELIGIBILITY. A pharmacy operating
- 13 in this state may apply to the department [board] to participate in
- 14 the pilot program if the pharmacy:
- 15 (1) is eligible to register [registered] as an
- 16 authorized drug collection site with the United States Drug
- 17 Enforcement Administration; and
- 18 (2) [is not the subject of state or federal opioid
- 19 litigation; and
- 20 [<del>(3)</del>] meets the eligibility requirements established
- 21 by 21 C.F.R. Section 1317.40 [and board rules].
- SECTION 4. Section 442A.052, Health and Safety Code, is
- 23 amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 442A.052. APPLICATION AND SELECTION PROCESSES. (a)
- 25 The <u>department</u> [board] shall <u>prescribe</u> [adopt rules prescribing:
- 26  $\left[\frac{(1)}{(1)}\right]$  the form and manner for a pharmacy to apply for
- 27 participation in the pilot program[; and

- 1 [(2) evaluation and selection criteria and
- 2 processes].
- 3 [(b)] The department [board] shall give priority for
- 4 participation in the pilot program to a pharmacy applicant that:
- 5 (1) does not collect unused ultimate user prescription
- 6 drugs under 21 C.F.R. Part 1317 at the time the applicant submits
- 7 the application; or
- 8 (2) is located in a rural or underserved area the
- 9 department [board] designates.
- 10 (b) [<del>(c)</del>] A pharmacy that operates multiple locations may
- 11 [must] submit one [an] application to apply for the program for all
- 12 of the locations, provided the application contains information
- 13 specific to each location, including the physical address, phone
- 14 number, location name, and pharmacy manager's name [for each
- 15 <del>location</del>]. <u>Each location is separately evaluated for</u>
- 16 prioritization under Subsection (a).
- SECTION 5. Section 442A.053(b), Health and Safety Code, is
- 18 amended to read as follows:
- 19 (b) Controlled substance prescription drugs, [and]
- 20 noncontrolled substance prescription drugs, and over-the-counter
- 21 drugs may be collected together and comingled.
- SECTION 6. Section 442A.055, Health and Safety Code, is
- 23 amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 442A.055. PHARMACY MANAGEMENT; RECORDS. A
- 25 participating pharmacy is responsible for the daily management and
- 26 recordkeeping of the pharmacy's prescription drug safe disposal
- 27 program in accordance with the pharmacy's United States Drug

- 1 Enforcement Administration registration [and board rules].
- 2 SECTION 7. The heading to Subchapter C, Chapter 442A,
- 3 Health and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 4 SUBCHAPTER C. DEPARTMENT [BOARD] DUTIES
- 5 SECTION 8. Sections 442A.101(a) and (b), Health and Safety 6 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) The <u>department</u> [<del>board</del>] shall assist each pharmacy 8 participating in the pilot program, including by paying [<del>the costs</del>
- 9 of]:
- 10 (1) the costs of maintaining one collection receptacle
- 11 at each participating pharmacy location and destroying through
- 12 incineration of the receptacle's full inner liner containing the
- 13 prescription drugs collected [deposited] in the receptacle; and
- 14 (2) a one-time fee to offset the initial costs of
- 15 program participation [ordering and distributing pre-addressed,
- 16 return postage paid mail-back envelopes from a third-party
- 17 mail-back program and destroying through incineration the returned
- 18 mail-back envelopes containing the collected prescription drugs;
- 19 <del>and</del>
- [(3) other operational needs the board determines
- 21 appropriate].
- 22 (b) The <u>department may contract with a reverse distributor</u>
- 23 registered with the United States Drug Enforcement Administration
- 24 to install the collection receptacles at participating pharmacy
- 25 locations and to treat at an incineration facility registered with
- 26 the United States Drug Enforcement Administration the drugs
- 27 collected in the receptacles [board:

- 1 [(1) shall directly reimburse a participating
- 2 pharmacy for costs the pharmacy incurs under Subsection (a); and
- 3 [(2) may not reimburse a participating pharmacy for
- 4 the cost of using a third-party incineration facility unless the
- 5 facility is appropriately registered with the United States Drug
- 6 Enforcement Administration].
- 7 SECTION 9. Section 442A.102, Health and Safety Code, is
- 8 amended to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 442A.102. COMMUNITY OUTREACH. (a) The department
- 10 [board] shall:
- 11 (1) develop and distribute educational outreach
- 12 materials for the public about the availability of safe
- 13 prescription drug disposal in this state;
- 14 (2) post the materials on the department's [board's]
- 15 Internet website; [and]
- 16 (3) provide the materials to other state agencies,
- 17 including the Texas State Board of Pharmacy, for those agencies to
- 18 conduct the community outreach; and
- 19 (4) create education materials for voluntary use by a
- 20 participating pharmacy.
- (b) The educational outreach materials must be in English,
- 22 Spanish, and for specific areas of this state as the department
- 23 [board] determines appropriate, another language spoken by a
- 24 substantial portion of the area's residents.
- 25 SECTION 10. Section 442A.103, Health and Safety Code, is
- 26 amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 442A.103. REPORT. Not later than December 1 of each

even-numbered year, the department [board] shall submit to the 1 2 governor and the legislature a report that: (1)summarizes the results of the pilot program, 3 4 including: 5 (A) the number and geographic distribution of collection receptacles at participating pharmacies; 6 (B) the estimated amount of prescription drugs 7 collected by participating pharmacies under the program, measured 8 9 by: 10 (i) the number of inner liners fully filled 11 with collected prescription drugs and sent for incineration by the pharmacies; and 12 13 (ii) [the number of mail-back envelopes 14 distributed by the pharmacies; and 15 [(iii)] the weight, measured in pounds, of 16 the[+ 17 [<del>(a)</del>] inner liners described bу Subparagraph (i) [ ; and 18 [(b) returned mail-back envelopes 19 filled with collected prescription drugs]; 20 the cost of the pilot program; 21 (C) 22 [amount of money distributed under the pilot program and] the identity of each participating pharmacy to which 23

- 4 SECTION 11. Section 442A.151, Health and Safety Code, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 442A.151. FUNDING. (a) Money contained in the opioid
- 7 abatement account established under Section 403.505, Government
- 8 Code[, as added by Chapter 781 (S.B. 1827), Acts of the 87th
- 9 Legislature, Regular Session, 2021], shall [may] be appropriated to
- 10 the department [board] to fund the pilot program established under
- 11 this chapter.
- 12 (b) The <u>department</u> [board] may collect gifts, grants, and
- 13 donations to fund the program.
- 14 SECTION 12. Sections 442A.056 and 442A.101(c), Health and
- 15 Safety Code, are repealed.
- 16 SECTION 13. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 17 of this Act, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human
- 18 Services Commission shall adopt rules to allow the Department of
- 19 State Health Services to implement the prescription drug safe
- 20 disposal pilot program developed under Chapter 442A, Health and
- 21 Safety Code, as required by this Act.
- 22 SECTION 14. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
