4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subtitle B, Title 5, Insurance Code, is amended
6	by adding Chapter 524A to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 524A. PUBLIC EDUCATION ON HEALTH COVERAGE
8	Sec. 524A.001. BIENNIAL HEALTH COVERAGE REFERENCE GUIDE.
9	(a) The department shall develop and publish on the department's
10	Internet website a biennial reference guide designed to educate the
11	public about health coverage in this state. The department shall
12	also publish the guide in a printed form available to the public or
13	request.
14	(b) The reference guide must include the following
15	<pre>information:</pre>
16	(1) the biennial period covered by the current
17	edition;
18	(2) definitions of the term "health insurance" and
19	terms used to describe other forms of health coverage;

coverage may be obtained from each of those sources;

(3) sources from which consumers may obtain health

(4) a guide to consumer rights and resources related

1	(5) a health coverage shopping guide that includes:
2	(A) an explanation of discount cards, health care
3	sharing ministries, and other non-insurance health coverage
4	products and a comparison of those products to health insurance;
5	(B) an explanation and comparison of common types
6	of short-term or disease-specific health coverage;
7	(C) an explanation and comparison of preferred
8	provider benefit plans, exclusive provider benefit plans, health
9	maintenance organizations, and point-of-service plans;
10	(D) an explanation of provider networks and the
11	differences between in-network providers and out-of-network
12	providers;
13	(E) an explanation of the Affordable Care Act
14	marketplace plan categories of bronze, silver, gold, and platinum;
15	(F) an explanation of the out-of-pocket costs of
16	health coverage, including premiums, deductibles, copayments, and
17	coinsurance; and
18	(G) information on how to recognize health
19	coverage scams;
20	(6) an explanation of the effect of the Consolidated
21	Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1985 (Pub. L. No. 99-272) on
22	<pre>consumers' health coverage;</pre>
23	(7) a basic overview of federal, state, and local
24	programs that may assist consumers to obtain health care services;
25	(8) methods for a consumer to resolve disputes with a
26	health coverage issuer or administrator;
27	(9) methods to seek assistance from the department for

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- 1 <u>a complaint regarding a health coverage plan or product; and</u>
- 2 (10) the areas of health coverage regulated by the
- 3 department and those regulated by federal law, including the
- 4 Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (29 U.S.C. Section
- 5 <u>1001 et seq.</u>).
- 6 SECTION 2. The Texas Department of Insurance shall publish
- 7 the first biennial reference guide under Section 524A.001,
- 8 Insurance Code, as added by this Act, not later than January 1,
- 9 2026.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
