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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to senior retirement communities.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subtitle B, Title 9, Health and Safety Code, is
5	amended by adding Chapter 786 to read as follows:
6	CHAPTER 786. SENIOR RETIREMENT COMMUNITIES
7	Sec. 786.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
8	(1) "Chronic condition residential customer" means a
9	residential customer who has a person permanently residing in the
10	customer's home who has been diagnosed by a physician as having a
11	serious medical condition that requires an electric-powered
12	medical device or electric heating or cooling to prevent the
13	impairment of a major life function through a significant
14	deterioration or exacerbation of the person's medical condition.
15	(2) "Common amenity" means an amenity or service
16	offered or provided to residents of a multiunit residential
17	<pre>property, including:</pre>
18	(A) concierge services;
19	(B) a library;
20	(C) common dining services;
21	(D) housekeeping services; and
22	(E) full-time security.
23	(3) "Critical care residential customer" and
24	"customer" have the meanings assigned by Section 17.002, Utilities

1 Code. (4) "Electric cooperative" and "municipally owned 2 utility" have the meanings assigned by Section 11.003, Utilities 3 4 Code. 5 (5) "Electric utility" has the meaning assigned by Section 31.002, Utilities Code. 6 7 (6) "Resident" means an individual who resides in a senior retirement community as a unit owner or tenant. 8 (7) "Senior retirement community" means a residential 9 community or a portion of a residential community: 10 (A) described by Section 301.043, Property Code; 11 (B) that contains not fewer than 20 residential 12 13 units in one or more multiunit buildings that are available to own, rent, or lease; and 14 15 (C) that provides common amenities. 16 (8) "Senior retirement community contract" means a 17 contract with a resident of a senior retirement community for providing a common amenity to a resident. 18 (9) "Unit" means a physical portion of a residential 19 20 property designated for separate ownership or occupancy. Sec. 786.002. EXEMPTIONS. This chapter does not apply to: 21 22 (1) a health care institution as defined by Section 74.001, Civil Practice and Remedies Code; 23 24 (2) a boarding home facility as defined by Section 25 260.001 that holds a permit issued under Chapter 260;

individuals operated under Section 202, the National Housing Act

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(3) a supportive housing facility for elderly

- 2 (4) a center for independent living as defined by
- 3 Section 702 of the federal Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 U.S.C.
- 4 Section 796a); or
- 5 (5) any other facility that is regulated by the Health
- 6 and Human Services Commission or in accordance with rules adopted
- 7 by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services.
- 8 <u>Sec. 786.003. EMERGENCY RESPONSE PLAN.</u> (a) A senior
- 9 retirement community shall prepare, maintain, and annually update a
- 10 written emergency response plan.
- 11 (b) The emergency response plan must:
- 12 (1) describe methods to be used to communicate with
- 13 residents during a disaster;
- 14 (2) provide for at least one employee to stay on site
- 15 during a disaster unless the disaster results in an evacuation of
- 16 the senior retirement community;
- 17 (3) provide for the provision of food, water, and
- 18 essential supplies to residents during a disaster by the senior
- 19 retirement community or a contracted entity;
- 20 (4) detail the options for the transport of residents
- 21 during an evacuation;
- 22 (5) provide for emergency planning meetings for the
- 23 residents to occur at least twice each year; and
- 24 (6) include a compilation of disaster preparation
- 25 resources available to residents, including 2-1-1 services
- 26 provided by the Texas Information and Referral Network,
- 27 registration with the State of Texas Emergency Assistance Registry,

- 1 and registration with the electric utility, electric cooperative,
- 2 or municipally owned utility that serves the resident to receive a
- 3 designation as a critical care residential customer, chronic
- 4 condition residential customer, or any other designation the
- 5 utility or cooperative offers for the purpose of prioritizing the
- 6 restoration of service or providing notice to customers regarding
- 7 outages.
- 8 <u>(c) A senior retirement community shall:</u>
- 9 <u>(1) provide the emergency response plan to each</u>
- 10 resident;
- 11 (2) provide the emergency response plan to a
- 12 resident's family member on request; and
- 13 (3) post a written notice of the emergency response
- 14 plan in a conspicuous manner at a location on the community premises
- 15 where the community posts other community notices.
- Sec. 786.004. AGREEMENT OR CONTRACT PROVISIONS. A lease,
- 17 rental, or purchase agreement for a residential unit in a senior
- 18 retirement community or a senior retirement community contract with
- 19 a resident:
- 20 (1) must include a copy of the emergency response plan
- 21 that the community has adopted as required by Section 786.003; and
- (2) may not include a provision that controls the
- 23 content or execution of the resident's advance directive or
- 24 testamentary documents.
- Sec. 786.005. HEALTH AND SAFETY INVESTIGATIONS AND RESIDENT
- 26 COMMUNICATIONS. A senior retirement community may not:
- 27 (1) prevent or inhibit a resident from or penalize a

- 1 resident for communicating with a law enforcement officer, social
- 2 worker, family member, or other interested person regarding the
- 3 health and safety of residents of the senior retirement community;
- 4 <u>or</u>
- 5 (2) prevent a law enforcement officer, court officer,
- 6 social worker, family member, or other invited person from entering
- 7 <u>a common area of the senior retirement community to conduct a</u>
- 8 voluntary interview with a resident as part of an investigation
- 9 into the health and safety of residents of the community or
- 10 regarding an incident at the community.
- 11 SECTION 2. (a) A senior retirement community is not
- 12 required to comply with Section 786.003, Health and Safety Code, as
- 13 added by this Act, before January 1, 2026.
- 14 (b) Section 786.004, Health and Safety Code, as added by
- 15 this Act, applies only to an agreement or contract entered into or
- 16 renewed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 17 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
