A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the participation of certain juvenile justice entities
- 3 in the Jobs and Education for Texans (JET) Grant Program.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 134.004, Education Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 134.004. JOBS AND EDUCATION FOR TEXANS (JET) GRANT
- 8 PROGRAM. (a) The commission shall establish and administer the
- 9 Jobs and Education for Texans (JET) Grant Program to provide grants
- 10 to public junior colleges, public technical institutes, public
- 11 state colleges, [and] school districts and open-enrollment charter
- 12 schools, and the Texas Juvenile Justice Department, juvenile
- 13 boards, and juvenile probation departments described under Section
- 14 134.007. To receive the grants, those entities must [that] apply to
- 15 the advisory board in the manner prescribed by the advisory board.
- 16 The commission shall award the grants on the advice and
- 17 recommendations of the advisory board.
- 18 (b) Grants may be awarded under this chapter from the Jobs
- 19 and Education for Texans (JET) fund to defray the start-up costs
- 20 associated with the development of new career and technical
- 21 education programs at public junior colleges, public technical
- 22 institutes, public state colleges, [and] school districts and
- 23 open-enrollment charter schools, and the Texas Juvenile Justice
- 24 Department, juvenile boards, and juvenile probation departments

- 1 described under Section 134.007 if those entities [that] meet the
- 2 requirements of Section 134.006.
- 3 SECTION 2. Sections 134.006(a) and (c), Education Code, are
- 4 amended to read as follows:
- 5 (a) The commission may award a grant for the development of
- 6 new career and technical education courses or programs at public
- 7 junior colleges, public technical institutes, public state
- 8 colleges, [and] school districts and open-enrollment charter
- 9 schools, and the Texas Juvenile Justice Department, juvenile
- 10 boards, and juvenile probation departments described under Section
- 11 134.007.
- 12 (c) In awarding a grant under this section, the commission
- 13 shall primarily consider the potential economic returns to the
- 14 state from the development of the career and technical education
- 15 course or program. The commission may also consider whether the
- 16 course or program:
- 17 (1) is part of a new, emerging industry or high-demand
- 18 occupation;
- 19 (2) offers new or expanded dual credit career and
- 20 technical educational opportunities in public high schools;
- 21 (3) offers new career and technical educational
- 22 opportunities not previously available:
- $\underline{\text{(A)}}$ to students enrolled at any campus in the
- 24 Windham School District; or
- 25 (B) as part of any existing educational programs
- 26 that are offered in facilities operated wholly or partly by the
- 27 Texas Juvenile Justice Department, a juvenile board, or a juvenile

- 1 probation department, including a facility operated by a private
- 2 vendor under a contract with the Texas Juvenile Justice Department,
- 3 a juvenile board, or a juvenile probation department; or
- 4 (4) is provided in cooperation with other public
- 5 junior colleges, public technical institutes, or public state
- 6 colleges across existing service areas.
- 7 SECTION 3. Section 134.007, Education Code, is amended to
- 8 read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 134.007. GRANTS AWARDED TO SCHOOL DISTRICTS, [DISTRICT
- 10 OR OPEN-ENROLLMENT CHARTER SCHOOLS, OR CERTAIN JUVENILE JUSTICE
- $11 \quad \underline{\text{ENTITIES}} \quad [\text{SCHOOL}]$. The commission may award a grant under this
- 12 chapter to:
- 13 (1) an independent school district or open-enrollment
- 14 charter school if the district or school has entered into a
- 15 partnership with a public junior college, public technical
- 16 institute, or public state college for the purpose of:
- 17 (A) promoting career and technical education to
- 18 the district's or school's students; or
- 19 (B) offering dual credit courses to the
- 20 district's or school's students; [or]
- 21 (2) the Windham School District; or
- 22 (3) the Texas Juvenile Justice Department, a juvenile
- 23 board, or a juvenile probation department.
- 24 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 25 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 26 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 27 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
