4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 155, Occupations Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 155.108 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 155.108. LICENSE FOR MILITARY VETERAN TO PRACTICE
8	MEDICINE. (a) In this section, "active duty" and "armed forces of
9	the United States" have the meanings assigned by Section 55.001.
10	(b) The board shall issue a license to practice medicine to
11	an applicant who:
12	(1) is licensed in good standing as a physician ir
13	another state;
14	(2) is a veteran of the armed forces of the United
15	States who retired from or otherwise left military service not more
16	than one year before the application date for a license under this
17	section;
18	(3) was, at the time of retiring from or leaving
19	military service:
20	(A) serving on active duty in this state; and
21	(B) authorized as a physician to treat persons
22	enlisted in the armed forces of the United States or veterans; and
23	(4) has passed the Texas medical jurisprudence
24	examination.

1	(c) The board may not issue a license under this section to
2	an applicant who:
3	(1) was discharged or separated from the armed forces
4	of the United States:
5	(A) on the basis of substandard conduct; or
6	(B) for any act of misconduct or moral or
7	<pre>professional dereliction;</pre>
8	(2) holds a medical license or a license to prescribe,
9	dispense, administer, supply, or sell a controlled substance that:
10	(A) is currently under active investigation; or
11	(B) is or was subject to a disciplinary order or
12	action or to denial by another jurisdiction; or
13	(3) has been convicted of, is on deferred adjudication
14	community supervision or deferred disposition for, or is under
15	active investigation for the commission of:
16	(A) a felony; or
17	(B) a misdemeanor involving moral turpitude.
18	SECTION 2. Subchapter F, Chapter 301, Occupations Code, is
19	amended by adding Section 301.262 to read as follows:
20	Sec. 301.262. LICENSE FOR MILITARY VETERAN TO PRACTICE
21	MEDICINE. (a) In this section, "active duty" and "armed forces of
22	the United States" have the meanings assigned by Section 55.001.
23	(b) The board shall issue a license to practice nursing to
24	an applicant who:
25	(1) is licensed in good standing as a nurse in another
26	state;
27	(2) is a veteran of the armed forces of the United

States who retired from or otherwise left military corrige not more
States who retired from or otherwise left military service not more
than one year before the application date for a license under this
section;
(3) was, at the time of retiring from or otherwise
<pre>leaving military service:</pre>
(A) serving on active duty in this state; and
(B) authorized as a nurse to treat persons
enlisted in the armed forces of the United States or veterans; and
(4) has passed the jurisprudence examination.
(c) The board may not issue a license under this section to
an applicant who:
(1) was discharged or separated from the armed forces
of the United States:
(A) on the basis of substandard conduct; or
(B) for any act of misconduct or moral or
<pre>professional dereliction;</pre>
(2) holds a nursing license or a license to prescribe,
dispense, administer, supply, or sell a controlled substance that:
(A) is currently under active investigation; or
(B) is or was subject to a disciplinary order or
action or to denial by another jurisdiction; or
(3) has been convicted of, is on deferred adjudication
community supervision or deferred disposition for, or is under
active investigation for the commission of:
(A) a felony; or
(B) a misdemeanor involving moral turpitude.
SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
