6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
7	SECTION 1. Chapter 444, Health and Safety Code, as added by
8	Chapter 2 (S.B. 497), Acts of the 88th Legislature, Regular
9	Session, 2023, is redesignated as Chapter 445, Health and Safety
10	Code, and amended to read as follows:
11	CHAPTER $\underline{445}$ [444]. MANUFACTURE, DISTRIBUTION, AND SALE OF KRATOM
12	PRODUCTS
13	Sec. $\underline{445.001}$ [$\underline{444.001}$]. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
14	(1) "Food" has the meaning assigned by Section
15	431.002.
16	(2) "Kratom" means any part of the leaf of the plant of
17	the species Mitragyna speciosa.
18	(3) "Kratom processor" means a person who:
19	(A) processes kratom for a kratom product;
20	(B) manufactures, prepares, or distributes[, or
21	<pre>maintains] kratom products for sale;</pre>
22	(C) [(B)] advertises, represents, or holds

23 oneself out as a manufacturer $\underline{\text{or}}[_{\pmb{\tau}}]$ preparer $[_{\pmb{\tau}}$ or seller] of kratom

24 products;

1 (D) $[\frac{C}{C}]$ is responsible for ensuring the purity 2 and proper labeling of kratom products; or (E) [(D)] packages or labels kratom products. 3 (4) "Kratom product" means a food that contains[____ 4 5 including an extract, capsule, or pill, containing any form of] 6 kratom. 7 (5) "Kratom retailer" means a person [kratom processor] who sells or offers for sale kratom products to 8 9 consumers or who advertises, represents, or holds oneself out as a person who sells kratom products to consumers. 10 (6) "Manufacture" has the meaning assigned by Section 11 431.002. 12 13 Sec. 445.002 [444.002]. TESTING AND LABELING [LABEL] REQUIRED. Before a kratom product is sold at retail or 14 (a) otherwise introduced into commerce in this state, a sample 15 representing the kratom product must be tested: 16 (1) by a laboratory that is: 17 18 (A) located in this state; and (B) accredited by an accreditation body in 19 20 accordance with International Organization for Standardization ISO/IEC 17025 or a comparable or successor standard; and 21 22 (2) to determine: 23 (A) the concentration and identity of the alkaloids in the product; and 24 25 (B) the presence or quantity of heavy metals,

pesticides, microbial contamination, and any other substances in

the product as prescribed by the executive commissioner.

- 1 (b) A kratom processor shall label each kratom product with
- 2 the product use directions necessary to ensure safe use of the
- 3 product by a consumer, including the recommended serving size for
- 4 the product.
- 5 (c) [(b)] A kratom retailer may only sell a kratom product
- 6 that is properly tested and labeled in accordance with this
- 7 section.
- 8 (d) A person commits an offense if the person sells or
- 9 offers for sale a kratom product or a product marketed as containing
- 10 kratom that is not tested or labeled as required by this section.
- 11 (e) An offense under this section is a Class A misdemeanor.
- 12 Sec. 445.003 [444.003]. ADULTERATED, CONTAMINATED, AND
- 13 PROHIBITED KRATOM PRODUCTS. (a) A person commits an offense if
- 14 the person manufactures, prepares, distributes, sells, or offers
- 15 for sale [A kratom processor or kratom retailer may not prepare,
- 16 distribute, sell, or offer to sell] a kratom product that:
- 17 (1) is adulterated with a dangerous non-kratom
- 18 substance affecting the quality or strength of the product to a
- 19 degree that renders the product injurious to a consumer;
- 20 (2) is contaminated with a poisonous or otherwise
- 21 deleterious non-kratom substance, including any substance
- 22 designated as a controlled substance by Chapter 481 (Texas
- 23 Controlled Substances Act);
- 24 (3) contains a level of 7-hydroxymitragynine in the
- 25 alkaloid fraction that is greater than 0.1 [two] percent of the
- 26 overall alkaloid composition of the product; [or]
- 27 (4) contains any artificial or synthetic alkaloids,

- 1 including artificial or synthetic 7-hydroxymitragynine and
- 2 synthetically derived compounds from [a] kratom;
- 3 (5) is a prepackaged beverage; or
- 4 (6) is a prepackaged food other than:
- 5 (A) raw or dried kratom leaves;
- 6 (B) ground kratom leaves;
- 7 <u>(C) kratom leaf powder; or</u>
- 8 (D) clear capsules containing kratom leaf powder
- 9 [plant].
- 10 (b) An offense under this section is a Class A misdemeanor.
- (c) A kratom product described by Subsection (a) is
- 12 considered to be adulterated for purposes of Chapter 431.
- 13 Sec. 445.004 [444.004]. OFFENSE: [FOR] DISTRIBUTION OR
- 14 SALE OF KRATOM PRODUCT TO INDIVIDUAL YOUNGER THAN 21 YEARS OF AGE
- 15 [MINOR]. (a) A person commits an offense if the person
- 16 distributes, sells, or exposes for sale a kratom product or a
- 17 product marketed as containing kratom to an individual younger than
- 18 21 [18] years of age.
- 19 (b) An offense under this section is a Class A $\left[\frac{C}{2}\right]$
- 20 misdemeanor.
- Sec. 445.005. OFFENSE: SALE OR DELIVERY OF CERTAIN KRATOM
- 22 PRODUCTS NEAR SCHOOL. (a) In this section, "school" and
- 23 "premises" have the meanings assigned by Section 481.134.
- 24 (b) A person commits an offense if the person sells, offers
- 25 for sale, or delivers a kratom product or a product marketed as
- 26 containing kratom in, on, or within 1,000 feet of the premises of a
- 27 school.

- 1 (c) An offense under this section is a Class A misdemeanor.
- Sec. 445.006. OFFENSE: FALSE LABORATORY REPORT. (a) A
- 3 person commits an offense if the person, with the intent to deceive,
- 4 forges, falsifies, or <u>alters the results of a laboratory test</u>
- 5 authorized or required by this chapter.
- 6 (b) An offense under this section is a felony of the third
- 7 degree.
- 8 Sec. 445.007. OFFENSE: SALE OF OTHER PRODUCTS PROHIBITED.
- 9 (a) A person commits an offense if the person sells or offers for
- 10 <u>sale a kratom product or a product marketed as containing kratom at</u>
- 11 <u>a location that also sells or offers for sale the following products</u>
- 12 or products marketed as the following products:
- 13 (1) a consumable hemp product as defined by Section
- 14 443.001;
- 15 (2) a cigarette, e-cigarette, or tobacco product as
- 16 defined by Section 161.081; or
- 17 (3) an alcoholic beverage as defined by Section 1.04,
- 18 Alcoholic Beverage Code.
- 19 (b) An offense under this section is a Class A misdemeanor.
- Sec. 445.0071. OFFENSE: MANUFACTURE, DISTRIBUTION, OR SALE
- 21 OF KRATOM PRODUCT FOR SMOKING. (a) In this section, "smoking"
- 22 means burning or igniting a substance and inhaling the smoke or
- 23 heating a substance and inhaling the resulting vapor or aerosol.
- 24 (b) A person commits an offense if the person manufactures,
- 25 distributes, sells, or offers for sale a kratom product or a product
- 26 marketed as containing kratom for smoking.
- 27 (c) An offense under this section is a Class A misdemeanor.

- 1 Sec. 445.0072. OFFENSE: MANUFACTURE, DISTRIBUTION, OR SALE
- 2 OF PILL OR TABLET CONTAINING KRATOM. (a) A person commits an
- 3 offense if the person manufactures, distributes, sells, or offers
- 4 for sale a pill or tablet that contains kratom or that is marketed
- 5 as containing kratom. For purposes of this subsection, a capsule is
- 6 not considered to be a pill or tablet.
- 7 (b) An offense under this section is a Class A misdemeanor.
- Sec. <u>445.008</u> [<u>444.005</u>]. CIVIL PENALTY. (a) A person who violates this chapter is subject to a civil penalty in the amount
- 11 (1) $\frac{$2,500}{$250}$ for the first violation;
- 12 (2) \$5,000 [\$500] for the second violation; and
- 13 (3) $$10,000 \left[\frac{$1,000}{}\right]$ for each subsequent violation.
- 14 (b) Each day a violation continues or occurs is a separate 15 violation for purposes of imposing a penalty under this section.
- 16 (c) [A kratom retailer is not liable for a civil penalty
- 17 under this section for a violation of Section 444.002 or 444.003 if
- 18 the kratom retailer proves by a preponderance of the evidence that
- 19 the violation was unintentional and due to the kratom retailer's
- 20 good faith reliance on the representation of another kratom
- 21 processor.
