- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 161.0074(d), Health and Safety Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (d) <u>In</u> [If a public health disaster was declared under
- 8 Chapter 81 during the preceding two years, in] addition to the
- 9 information required under Subsection (c), for immunizations that
- 10 immunize an individual against a [the] communicable disease
- 11 [subject to the declaration] the report must:
- 12 (1) include information by county on the accessibility
- 13 to the immunizations of county residents by age, race, disability,
- 14 and geographic location, provided the information does not
- 15 personally identify any individual;
- 16 (2) identify and assess disparities in access to the
- 17 immunizations by age, race, <u>disability</u>, and geographic location,
- 18 including an assessment of immunization accessibility in each
- 19 county;
- 20 (3) include the estimated economic benefit to this
- 21 state of reducing disparities in immunization accessibility;
- 22 (4) include recommendations for reducing disparities
- 23 in immunization accessibility; and
- 24 (5) include recommendations for legislative action to

- 1 increase immunization rates.
- 2 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 3 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 4 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 5 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 6 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
