is amended by adding Section 621.512 to read as follows:

- 10 CIRCUMSTANCES. (a) A person commits an offense if the person
- 11 operates or moves an overweight vehicle described by Subsection (b)

- 13 (1) that is not included in the route designated under
- 14 the permit under which the vehicle is operating; or
- 15 (2) without a permit authorizing the movement of the
- 16 vehicle and the vehicle exceeds the maximum gross weight authorized
- 17 for the vehicle by at least five percent.
- 18 (b) Subsection (a) applies only to an overweight vehicle
- 19 with at least three axles that is transporting in a cargo tank
- 20 hazardous materials in a quantity requiring placarding by a
- 21 regulation issued under the Hazardous Materials Transportation Act
- 22 (49 U.S.C. Section 5101 et seq.).
- (c) An offense under this section is a felony of the second
- 24 degree.

- 1 (d) It is an affirmative defense to prosecution of an
- 2 offense under this section that, at the time of the offense, the
- 3 vehicle was being operated or moved under the immediate direction
- 4 <u>of a law enforcement agency.</u>
- 5 (e) It is an affirmative defense to prosecution of an
- 6 offense under Subsection (a)(1) that, at the time of the offense,
- 7 the vehicle was being operated or moved in compliance with a permit
- 8 <u>authorizing the movement of the vehicle issued by the department or</u>
- 9 <u>a political subdivision of this state.</u>
- 10 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
