- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 42.252(c), Human Resources Code, is 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 (c) The operational plan must include:
- 9 (1) a community engagement plan to develop and, if
- 10 necessary, improve relations between the general residential
- 11 operation and the community in which the operation is located that
- 12 includes:

- 13 (A) a summary of any discussions the operation
- 14 had with:
- 15 (i) local law enforcement; and
- 16 (ii) local health, therapeutic, and
- 17 recreational resources available to support children at the
- 18 operation; and
- 19 (B) a summary of the opportunities the children
- 20 at the operation will have for social interaction in the community;
- 21 (2) an educational plan describing the applicant's
- 22 plan to provide for the educational needs of the children at the
- 23 general residential operation that:
- 24 (A) identifies whether the proposed operation

- 1 will provide for the public or private education of school-age
- 2 children at the operation;
- 3 (B) identifies whether the proposed operation
- 4 will provide for the education of school-age children through a
- 5 local school, off-site charter school, or on-site charter school;
- 6 (C) includes a written agreement [any
- 7 discussions, plans, and agreements] with the local school district,
- 8 private school, or local charter school that will be providing
- 9 education to the school-age children at the operation that includes
- 10 information about the location where education services will be
- 11 provided and the transportation of children to that location; and
- 12 (D) if the children are to be enrolled in a public
- 13 school, includes either:
- 14 (i) a statement from the local independent
- 15 school district on the impact of the proposed child-care services
- 16 on the local school district; or
- 17 (ii) an explanation of the reasons the
- 18 operation was unable to obtain a statement described by
- 19 Subparagraph (i) and a discussion of other alternative educational
- 20 services that the operation could offer;
- 21 (3) a trauma-informed plan to address unauthorized
- 22 absences of children from the general residential operation;
- 23 (4) a suicide prevention, intervention, and
- 24 postvention plan that meets the requirements of Section 42.0433;

- 26 (5) the qualifications, background, and history,
- 27 including any compliance history, of each individual who is

- 1 proposed to be involved in:
- 2 (A) the management of the operation; and
- 3 (B) the educational leadership of the operation
- 4 if the operation will be using an on-site charter school.
- 5 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
