## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

| 5  | BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:             |
| 6  | SECTION 1. Subchapter Z, Chapter 29, Education Code, is             |
| 7  | amended by adding Section 29.935 to read as follows:                |
| 8  | Sec. 29.935. STUDENT SUCCESS INITIATIVE PROGRAM; GRANTS.            |
| 9  | (a) The agency, in collaboration with qualified experts in the      |
| 10 | areas of child and youth mental health and education, shall develop |
| 11 | a student success initiative program based on evidence-based best   |
| 12 | <pre>practices to:</pre>  |
| 13 | (1) support youth well-being and educational                        |
| 14 | outcomes; and   |
| 15 | (2) increase the number of students performing at                   |
| 16 | grade level by providing academic, community, and governmental      |
| 17 | supports.   |
| 18 | (b) From money appropriated or otherwise available for the          |
| 19 | purpose, the commissioner shall provide technical assistance and    |
| 20 | award grants to school districts and open-enrollment charter        |
| 21 | schools that implement the program developed under Subsection (a).  |
| 22 | (c) In awarding grants under Subsection (b), the                    |
| 23 | commissioner shall:   |

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(1) award 75 percent of the amount available during

- 1 each school year to school districts that serve a population of
- 2 100,000 students or more; and
- 3 (2) prioritize school districts and open-enrollment
- 4 charter schools with high percentages of students who:
- 5 (A) do not perform satisfactorily on assessment
- 6 instruments administered under Section 39.023; or
- 7 <u>(B) are educationally disadvantaged.</u>
- 8 (d) The commissioner may use not more than 10 percent of the
- 9 money appropriated for purposes of this section to cover the cost of
- 10 <u>administering this section</u>.
- 11 (e) The agency shall annually submit to the legislature a
- 12 report on the impact of the student success initiative program and
- 13 best practices learned from the program.
- 14 (f) The commissioner shall adopt rules as necessary to
- 15 implement this section, including rules establishing:
- 16 (1) application criteria for receipt of a grant under
- 17 this section; and
- 18 (2) allowable uses of grant money by a school district
- 19 or open-enrollment charter school under this section, which must
- 20 include supports for students such as tutoring, mentoring, and
- 21 other educational opportunities outside of the district or school.
- 22 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
