5	SECTION 1. Subtitle C, Title 3, Occupations Code, is
6	amended by adding Chapter 207 to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 207. ADVANCED COSMETIC PROCEDURE LICENSE
8	SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS
9	Sec. 207.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
10	(1) "Advanced cosmetic procedure" means a nonsurgical
11	cosmetic procedure, including:
12	(A) the injection of a prescription or other
13	substance for a cosmetic purpose;
14	(B) a cosmetic treatment that pierces through,
15	scrapes, or damages the dermis; and
16	(C) the use for a cosmetic purpose of a device as
17	defined by Section 551.003.
18	(2) "Commission" means the Texas Commission of
19	Licensing and Regulation.
20	(3) "Department" means the Texas Department of
21	Licensing and Regulation.
22	(4) "Physician" has the meaning assigned by Section
23	<u>151.002.</u>
24	Sec. 207.002. APPLICABILITY. A person is not required to

hold a license under this chapter if the person is a licensed health 1 2 care worker acting within the scope of the person's license. 3 SUBCHAPTER B. POWERS AND DUTIES Sec. 207.101. GENERAL POWERS AND DUTIES. The department 4 5 shall enforce this chapter. 6 SUBCHAPTER C. LICENSE REQUIREMENTS 7 Sec. 207.201. LICENSE REQUIRED. A person may not perform or attempt to perform an advanced cosmetic procedure unless the person 8 9 holds a license issued under this chapter. Sec. 207.202. LICENSE APPLICATION. An applicant for a 10 11 license under this chapter must apply to the department on a form 12 and in the manner prescribed by the department, accompanied by: 13 (1) evidence that the applicant: 14 (A) is at least 18 years of age; and 15 (B) has successfully completed: 16 (i) training the commission approves under 17 Section 207.203; and 18 (ii) the ex<u>amination developed</u> and administered by the department under Section 207.204; 19 20 (2) any other information required by the department, including sworn statements relating to the applicant's background 21 22 and legal status; and 23 (3) a fee in the amount set by the commission.

- 4 SUBCHAPTER D. PRACTICE BY LICENSE HOLDER
- 5 Sec. 207.301. AUTHORIZED ACTIVITIES. A license issued
- 6 under this subchapter:
- 7 (1) authorizes the license holder to perform only
- 8 advanced cosmetic procedures; and
- 9 (2) does not authorize the license holder to diagnose,
- 10 treat, or offer to treat any client for any illness, disease, or
- 11 injury of the human body.
- 12 Sec. 207.302. DISCLOSURE REQUIRED. The holder of a license
- 13 issued under this chapter shall specifically disclose in writing to
- 14 each client and prospective client the activities the license
- 15 holder is authorized and not authorized to perform under the
- license, as described by Section 207.301.
- Sec. 207.303. ONSITE SUPERVISION. The holder of a license
- 18 issued under this chapter, practicing under the written protocol of
- 19 a consulting physician, may perform an advanced cosmetic procedure
- 20 without the physician's onsite supervision.
- 21 SECTION 2. (a) Not later than December 1, 2025, the Texas
- 22 Commission of Licensing and Regulation shall adopt the rules,
- 23 forms, and fees necessary to administer Chapter 207, Occupations
- 24 Code, as added by this Act.
- 25 (b) Not later than March 1, 2026, the Texas Commission of
- 26 Licensing and Regulation shall:
- 27 (1) approve the training required under Section

- 1 207.203, Occupations Code, as added by this Act; and
- 2 (2) develop the examination required under Section
- 3 207.204, Occupations Code, as added by this Act.
- 4 SECTION 3. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of this
- 5 section, this Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
- 6 (b) Section 207.201, Occupations Code, as added by this Act,
- 7 takes effect July 1, 2026.
